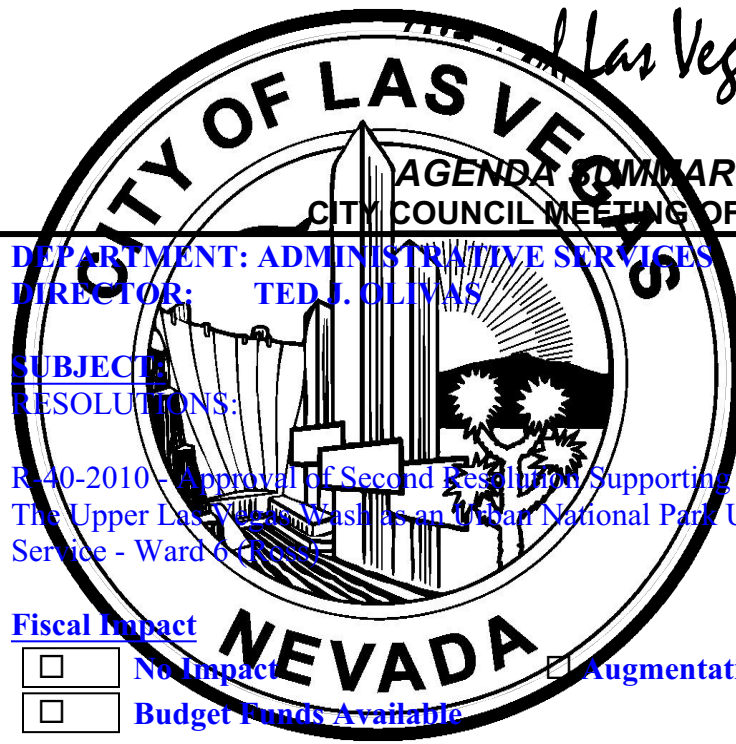

On November 18, 2009, the City Council adopted Resolution R-78-2009 for the purpose of urging the United States Congress, the U.S. Department of Interior, and the National Park Service to make a land management designation with respect to the Upper Las Vegas, and directed staff to work with local, tribal, and federal agencies and interested stakeholders to develop a concept for a new urban national park unit.
