Minutes:

CAROL MEYER, Business Services Supervisor, indicated the applicant has no criminal history. However, there was some concern relating to the conditions for this special use, and she submitted a letter staff received from the applicant.

NIEVES ALVAREZ appeared on behalf of the applicant.

COUNCILMAN REESE informed MS. MEYER that he met with the applicant and advised him that he could not support the sale of packaged liquor at his other establishment. However, with this application, he informed the applicant that he would consider allowing packaged liquor.

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COUNCILMAN REESE discussed with MS. MEYER the conditions, specifically Condition 2. MS. MEYER emphasized that, if approved, packaged liquor would be restricted to the miniature bottles for sale in gift baskets. For the Councilman, MS. ALVAREZ agreed with the condition as stated by MS. MEYER.
