Minutes:

JOE MAVIGLIA, Las Vegas resident, gave his telephone number, 292-9604, for people who need excellent plumbing services. He reminded the Council that he has not attended a meeting in a long time, because he feels the Council is doing a great job. But with the economic problems facing the country, he feels a different approach and a restructuring of the economy must be done because the economic situation is only going to worsen. People should be given jobs instead of being put in prison. He reminded the City that it could obtain a loan from the federal government to save and create City jobs.

DOROTHY BARNES, Las Vegas resident, said she is celebrating her 53rd birthday this month and has been in Las Vegas ten years, but she is concerned about Nellis Air Force putting her name on a list only to take money from her for programs. She has unsuccessfully tried numerous times to put an end to this. The police already advised Nellis to leave her alone, but the problems persist.

KEN SMALL passed out Las Vegas Tribune newspapers, a copy of which is included in the backup, and referred to an article about the Clark County School Board violating the rights of disabled children and breaking federal law by opting to ignore it. Five years ago he appeared before the School Board and pointed out the issue, and has requested an item on the agenda to discuss compliance with federal law that has been in existence since 1975. He urged people to comply with laws pertaining to disabled children. COUNCILWOMAN TARKANIAN advised MR. SMALL that even as a Trustee of the School Board, it was very difficult to ensure compliance with federal law.

BRUCE BONGARDT, BDB Industries, said he is looking to expand his business, which would draw people back into Las Vegas. He tests progressive attitudes and wants to implement a bottled water recycling program, which he described, with assistance from the City. He requested permission to put 25 of his posts and pay a daily wage, with the surplus going to charity. He requested the Council's consideration.

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TODD FARLOW, Las Vegas resident, asked if Item 64 of this meeting also dealt with homeless and sewer services, which he felt should be consolidated, like many other services. But he was adamant about not consolidating the Rapid Response Team.
