Minutes:

COUNCILMAN ANTHONY invited the residents of Ward 4 and every citizen to attend Coffee with the Mayor and him, Friday, July 9 from 8:30 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. at the Omelet House, 2227 North Rampart Boulevard, to discuss any concerns they might have.

COUNCILMAN WOLFSON showed a picture of a missing child provided by Nevada Child Seekers, and if anyone has seen the juvenile to the authorities. JESSICA ROMERO is a 15-year old runaway missing since December 2009 and may be in the company of a 20-year old Hispanic man named ALEX GIOVANNI GARCIA.

COUNCILMAN BARLOW indicated he will be teaming with NBA player JEROME WILLIAMS to sponsor a boot camp at the Doolittle Community Center taking place on July 12 through 14, for ages 10 to 12. The CJ Watson Camp will take place July 15 through 17. On July 13 at 6:00 p.m. he will be hosting a community meeting at the Doolittle Community Center to discuss the expansion of the Redevelopment Agency. He will be hosting the annual Ward 5 Summer Splash at the Doolittle Community Center on July 17 from 12:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.; all kids are invited to attend. He verified for COUNCILWOMAN TARKANIAN that the cost for the boot camp is \$60 per child and 20 kids will be sponsored through a scholarship.

MAYOR GOODMAN thanked the Council and staff for taking the lead as far as how government does business in Southern Nevada. There is no other entity that has had employees make concessions, which include not only going flat but having rollbacks. Even though it did not meet the Council's goal, it was designed to retain all of the employees and services the City provides. It is the first step towards changing the way people think about government compensation and commitment by government employees to understand that they do work in a real world. He thanked the Marshal Service for leading the way and Fire and Rescue because they set a standard that other firefighters in the community should look at very carefully, because it is in the best interest of the people who live here.

COUNCILMAN WOLFSON was pleased that the Council voted to accept the new proposed contract that leads in the right direction for creating the new City and new employee. He

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thanked the bargaining units for recognizing this is necessary and commended them because the alternative would have been costly.
