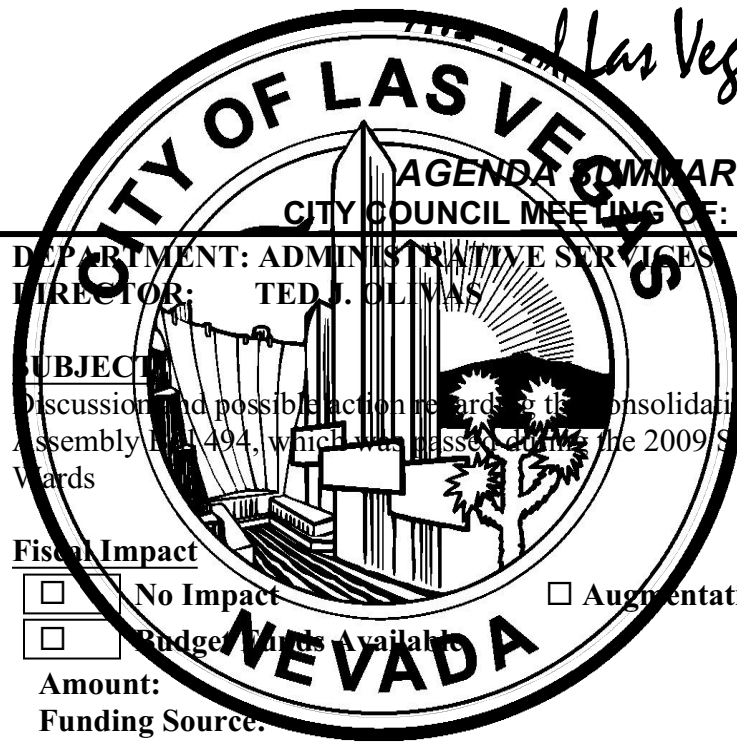

PURPOSE/BACKGROUND:

During the 2009 Legislature, Assembly Bill 494 (AB 494) was passed which requires the Board of County Commissioners of Clark County, the Board of County Commissioners of Washoe County and the governing body of each city in those counties, to submit a report to the 76th Session of the Nevada Legislature concerning the consolidation or reorganization of certain functions performed by those local governments.

PERRIGO added that they compiled the City's position on consolidation that states that there are a lot of opportunities to improve efficiencies, take a measured approach on how services will be consolidated. If approved today, the final copy will be submitted to the Southern Nevada Regional Planning Coalition on August 19, 2010 and upon their approval it will be forwarded to the Legislative Counsel Bureau by September 1, 2010.

Even though MAYOR GOODMAN did not agree with the report, he congratulated MS. LEE, who prepared the majority of the City's position, TED OLIVAS, Director of Administrative Services, and BRIAN KNUSEN, Administrative Officer, on a first-class, excellent work product.
