- D. If suspended, the licensee will be entitled to a hearing on the suspension by the City Council at the next available City Council meeting.
- E. There shall be an administrative approval of the permanent license by the Director after the six-month period.

## CITY COUNCIL MEETING OF: SEPTEMBER 1, 2010

### Minutes:

JIM DiFIORE, Manager, Business Services Division, explained that six months ago the City Council approved a temporary license subject to conditions. At that time, areas of concern were raised concerning MICHAEL NAPOLITANO'S ability to obtain an alcoholic beverage license. MR. DiFIORE outlined the five conditions complied with by MR. NAPOLITANO during the six-month period. Staff recommended extending the temporary license for another six-month period subject to the same conditions as outlined. MR. DiFIORE offered the option of a six-month review by the City Council and grant a permanent license at that time or allow for an administrative approval of the permanent license by the Director after the six-month period, if the applicant complies with all conditions.

ATTORNEY KAREN ROSS appeared on behalf of the applicant and indicated that her client has taken 11 permits and has been an outstanding member of the community. She concurred with MR. DiFIORE'S conditions and recommendation for an administrative approval.

COUNCILMAN BARLOW questioned the reason for not recommending a permanent license at this time given the fact that there have been no issues. MR. DiFIORE responded that in all cases staff exercises on the side of caution, since the applicant only took 11 applications over a six-month period. Staff would like to establish a track record that there have been no problems.
