Minutes:

JIM DiFIORE, Manager of Business Services, stated that DUSTIN HILL, who was present with KEN MATANOVICH, owner of Foothills Ranch, was granted a temporary work card, contingent on several conditions, which he read.

MR. HILL requested a permanent work card, as he would like to join the union, and he submitted a letter stating that he has been an exemplary employee.

MR. MATANOVICH assured the Council that MR. HILL is a very good employee, but he does not have enough work to keep him employed.

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MR. DiFIORE indicated that the dilemma is that MR. HILL would have to undergo the work card process again with any new employer. He supported a permanent work card with the City, contingent upon him notifying future employers of his background.

SERGEANT GLEN LOWE, Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department (Metro), confirmed for the Mayor that MR. HILL would have to start the work card process with any employer on the Strip. Also, MR. HILL could be issued a City work card with the requirement that he notify future employers of his past issues.

MR. DiFIORE requested an additional condition requiring that any potential future employer must submit a letter of support to Business Services. He noted that MR. HILL has earned a permanent work card.
