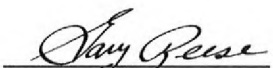


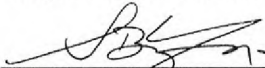
- Whereas;* The City of Las Vegas is committed to ensuring the safety and security of all those living in and visiting our city; and

- Whereas;* people cannot smell smoke when they sleep, poisonous gases and thick choking smoke can cause death in less than ninety seconds within a home if people do not evacuate promptly; and
- Whereas;* smoke alarms are your first line of defense against fire, especially when you sleep, which is the time when most fatal fire occurs; and
- Whereas;* Las Vegas Fire & Rescue is dedicated to reducing the occurrence of home fires and home fire injuries through prevention and fire safety education; and
- Whereas;* the 2010 Fire Prevention Week theme, "Smoke Alarms: A sound you can live with" effectively serves to remind us all of the simple actions we can take to stay safer from fire during Fire Prevention Week and year-round; and
- Therefore;* We, the Mayor and Members of the Las Vegas City Council, proudly proclaim October 3-9, 2010 as:

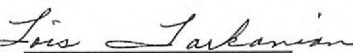
Fire Prevention Week 2010

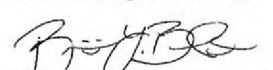
