Minutes:

TODD FARLOW, Las Vegas resident, stated that on the 9/17/2010 the television program Need to Know, a problem was discussed regarding deaths at residential care facilities due to lack of oversight and adequate care because of personnel reductions. Similarly, the City cut back on expenditures related to oversight of residential care facilities, and he would hate for lives of innocent people be lost due to budget cuts. MAYOR GOODMAN commented that such an issue should be brought to the attention of the Health District.

Additionally, MR. FARLOW complained about banks falsifying statements.

RASHAN JOSHUA COLLINS referred to his website and stated that the recession is the result of God's judgment. He said it grieved his spirit to learn of COUNCILMAN BARLOW'S comment that he does not want a homeless park, for which the Councilman should repent.

Addressing, CITY ATTORNEY BRAD JERBIC, MR. COLLINS advised him that abusing the elderly, depriving them of services and jailing them is illegal. He encouraged the Council to obey the laws. COUNCILMAN BARLOW stated that parks serve the purpose of enjoyment for citizens. The homeless are welcomed to visit the parks, but not to reside there.

ANTHONY HODGES, Las Vegas resident, commented that the homeless population is increasing, but agreed with COUNCILMAN BARLOW that the homeless should not be living in the parks. He then spoke about the upcoming 2011 Municipal Election and the potential candidates for mayor.
