Minutes:

ANTHONY HODGES was pleased with SENATOR HARRY REID'S victory in the recent election. He believes that he was partly responsible for paving the way for Alaska GOVERNOR SARAH PALIN during her previous candidacy for Vice President of the United States. He asked to meet with MAYOR GOODMAN privately, as he was sure he could provide direction to the Mayor after his tenure as Mayor.

LORD JESUS CHRIST (aka R. JOSHUA COLLINS) stated the Lord has returned, and he encouraged everyone to visit the website, lordjesuschrist.tk, for more information.
