Minutes:

KAREN COYNE, Chief Safety Officer, reviewed a PowerPoint presentation while it was shown on monitors.

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COUNCILMAN BARLOW received clarification from MS. COYNE that the statistics shown on slide 8 were cumulative from the program's inception, and that paid warrants were collected via several methods.

MS. COYNE strongly believes that the Warrant Service Pilot Program created a significant reduction in jail populations equating to significant operational savings.

COUNCILMAN ROSS recognized the men and women of the City Marshals and the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department as well as Council members for making the program a success.

City Marshals ALICIA MARTINO and DAVID COMPSON discussed their perspective of the program's success.

COUNCILMAN ANTHONY was proud to see that this employee-recommended program had been successfully created and managed by CHIEF COYNE. The Councilman also recommended sharing the results of this program with other jurisdictions facing layoffs.

CHIEF COYNE confirmed with COUNCILMAN WOLSTEN that there are no plans to hold amnesty days or programs. DEPUTY CITY MANAGER ORLANDO SANCHEZ had JAMES CARMANY, Court Administrator, come to the podium to explain why prior amnesty programs were eliminated.
