PURPOSE/BACKGROUND:

This bill will repeal Chapters 10.22 and 10.24 of the Municipal Code relating to radio reception interference and shortwave receivers in vehicles. The provisions were adopted several decades ago and have been made obsolete by changes in technology, the passage of time, and the assumption of regulatory jurisdiction by other levels of government.

CITY ATTORNEY BRAD JERBIC reviewed the Bill.

COUNCILWOMAN TARKANIAN questioned the need for this repeal and received clarification from ATTORNEY JERBIC that the original Bill was passed during a time when certain radios and scanners interfered with emergency services equipment, and that technological advances have eradicated the problem.

Second reading and bill adopted as introduced as Ordinance No. 6153.
