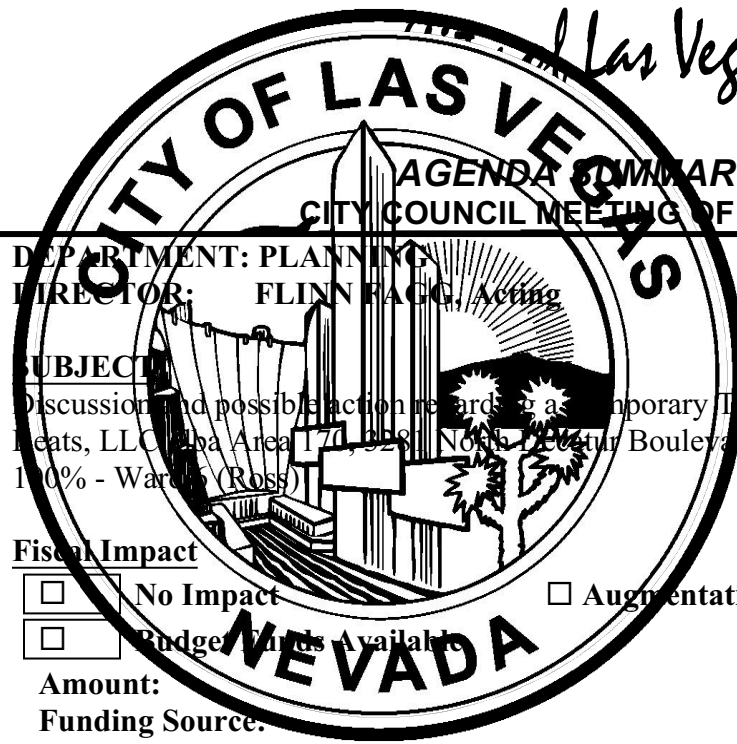

Minutes:

KAREN DUDDLESTEN, Business Licensing Manager, stated the facility is being used for adult events that serve liquor on nights the teenage club is not open. She indicated that there have been seven calls for service and two arrests (one of the owner and one of an employee who was acting as a manager).

JOSHUA OWENS, Owner, stated that he had been working with Metro to take care of noted corrective actions. DETECTIVE KENNETH NOGGLE, indicated that the teen dance hall has been discontinued and therefore Metro is unable to verify corrective actions were taken.

CITY COUNCIL MEETING OF: JUNE 15, 2011

MR. OWENS stated that he asked for and received guidance from Business Licensing regarding licensing requirements. CAROL MEYER, Business Services Supervisor, stated that MR. OWENS business model was for a teenage nightclub with occasional adult events and that he was advised of the laws concerning the selling of alcohol in facilities with teenage events.

MR. OWENS stated that there have been no code violations, no citations, no parental complaints and no fights at his business. He further clarified that his business has not only improved security measures, but also worked with city detectives to minimize risks. He believes that without this venue, teenagers will seek other underground entertainment venues. MS. DUDDLESTEN informed the Council of the seriousness of this arrest and service calls to the venue. An undercover officer witnessed a parent complaining to the doorman about his son coming home under the influence.

COUNCILMAN ROSS clarified that he appreciates the time and money MR. OWENS has spent on the development of his business, and that the result of this discussion does not affect MR. OWENS' other business licenses.
