Minutes:

CAROL MEYER, Business Services Supervisor, stated there were several attempts to meet with the owner regarding concerns surrounding the key employee, MR. GIBSON, due to his prior forced surrender of a similar business. ATTORNEY JAY BROWN, representing the applicant, stated that the owner has known MR. GIBSON for 25 years and that there have been no incidents eliciting concern from Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department although the owner did plead guilty to attempted theft in 2004 which was 16 years after the business opened with no other incidents before or since.

CITY COUNCIL MEETING OF: JUNE 15, 2011

COUNCILMAN WOLFSON received clarification from the investigator that the application did not specify a time period when asking for the disclosure of prior arrests. The Councilman also received clarification from ASSISTANT CITY ATTORNEY BRYAN K. SCOTT that surrender of a license would have been permanent if so ordered by a judge in the original case.

COUNCILMAN REESE stated that he has a concern about licensing MR. GIBSON as a key employee considering his history in the industry. The Councilman received confirmation from SERGEANT DONOVAN that there have been no recent incidents at this location.
