Dear Mayor Elect Carolyn G. Goodman:

On June 6, 2011, the City of Las Vegas received the Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) announcement of funding availability under the Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program for Fiscal Year 2011. The City of Las Vegas has been designated as the fiscal agent of the eligible \$1,273,801 in grant funding. The JAG funds are intended to support all components of the criminal justice system, including programs to prevent criminal activities and to improve court, corrections, treatment and justice information-sharing initiatives.

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Federal guidelines require that the governing body be notified of the FY11 JAG grant application 30 days in advance of the July 21, 2011 federal application submission deadline. This letter serves as your notification. Additionally, for recording purposes, the FY11 Local JAG Grant Application Solicitation notification was entered this date into the City Clerk SIRE system and is scheduled to be presented to City Council on July 6, 2011. (Please see enclosed grant application.)

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Following the committee's funding recommendations, the governing bodies of Clark County and the City of Las Vegas are to formally confirm the applicant allocations, and to engage in a Memorandum of Understanding, which enumerates the respective allocations.
