PURPOSE/BACKGROUND:

AB 494, passed during the 2009 legislative session, required a report from the jurisdictions in Clark County on the consolidation of services. As part of that effort, the SNRPC Coalition Board formed the Business License Workgroup, which was tasked with streamlining the licensing process across the jurisdictions in Clark County. Staff will provide a brief presentation on the efforts of the workgroup to date, and is seeking direction from City Council on the initial findings of the workgroup.
