Minutes:

COUNCILMAN ANTHONY reviewed the purpose and background of the bill. Human trafficking is a national problem that the National League of Cities is determined to stop. He has

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worked closely with Bamboo Bridges, a non-profit organization dedicated to the eradication of human trafficking. There has been no pushback from legitimate businesses because they are already operating according to City guidelines. He thanked City staff for their efforts on this bill and the Southern Nevada Health District (SNHD) for their involvement. The requirement of health cards places authority with the SNHD to close businesses while providing additional monitoring.
