Minutes:

CHAIR TROWBRIDGE declared the Public Hearing open.

DOUG RANKIN, Planning and Development, stated that the variance represents a 39 percent deviation from standards; however, staff supports the variance as the parking provided is adequate to meet the minimum staff levels for the fire station, as well as the limited number of visitors expected at the site. Staff recommended approval.

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SAM TOLEMAN, Architectural Project Manager, City of Las Vegas, appeared and concurred with the conditions.

DAVID STEINNAN, Vice President of Sun City Summerlin Community Association, was present and stated that the association's Architectural Design Review Committee supports the request.

CHAIR TROWBRIDGE clarified for TODD ELLSWORTH that the fire station will eventually be built.

COMMISSIONER ELLSWORTH expressed concern about the fire's noise. MR. STEINMAN explained that there are procedures in place prohibiting the siren and lights to run, depending on the time of day and the traffic. It will not be an issue for the community.

ASSISTANT CITY ATTORNEY BRYAN SCOTT clarified that that is a similar agreement that Fire Station 10 has where they do not run the lights through a major street.

CHAIR TROWBRIDGE declared the Public Hearing closed.
