Minutes:

CHAIR TROWBRIDGE declared the Public Hearing open.

DOUG RANKIN, Planning and Development, stated that the proposed use will not alter the square footage of the existing tenant space nor the condition of the site. The use would be compatible with the surrounding land uses and meets Title 19 requirements. Staff recommended approval.

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LAWRENCE MINDEN, Summerlin Jewelers, spoke on the companys reputation and was proud that the family business has been in existence since 1962 and has operated at the same location for the past 16 years. In addition to selling/repairing all types of jewelry and designing custom jewelry, they would like an approval to accept jewelry on consignment from their customers, which consist mostly of area residents. This will give these residents an opportunity to purchase the items from them rather than a pawn shop.

Speaking from experience, TEDDY RUSSELL agreed that this request would be an excellent added service to the customers and recommended approval.

MR. MINDEN confirmed his acceptance of all conditions for CHAIR TROWBRIDGE.
