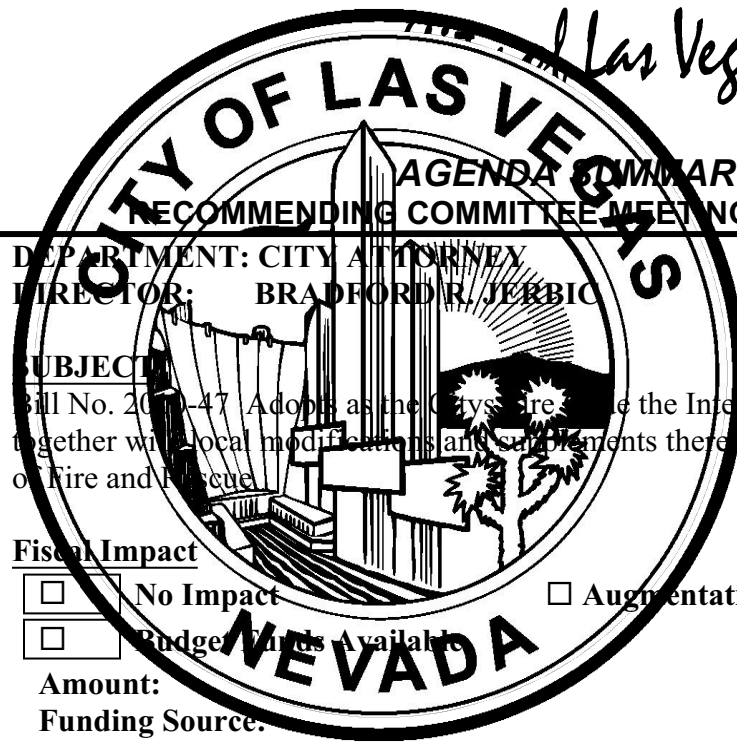

PURPOSE/BACKGROUND:

This bill will adopt as the City's Fire Code the International Fire Code, 2009 Edition, as amended by two additional documents: the Southern Nevada Amendments (area-wide consensus provisions) and a Supplemental Document containing amendments particular to the City of Las Vegas. The International Fire Code, as amended, will replace the NFPA 1, Uniform Fire Code, 2003 Edition, as adopted by the City previously. Although the NFPA 1 Code has served the City well, the International Fire Code is a better match with the building code and other related codes adopted by the City.

RECOMMENDATION:

This bill should be submitted to a Recommending Committee for review, hearing and recommendation to the City Council for final action.

Minutes:

COUNCILMAN ROSS declared the Public Hearing open.

DEPUTY FIRE CHIEF ROBERT BELL, City of Las Vegas Fire and Rescue, stated that the proposed bill will compliment the building code and other jurisdictions. Staff recommended approval.

CHIEF DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY VAL STEED pointed out that staff proposed the deletion of two items on the first page of the Supplemental Document that related to fire protection and helicopter emergency landing pad. Since the bill's production, it was decided to retain those items, so the Southern Nevada Amendments have been provided. Staff recommended the Bill be adopted as First Amendment.
