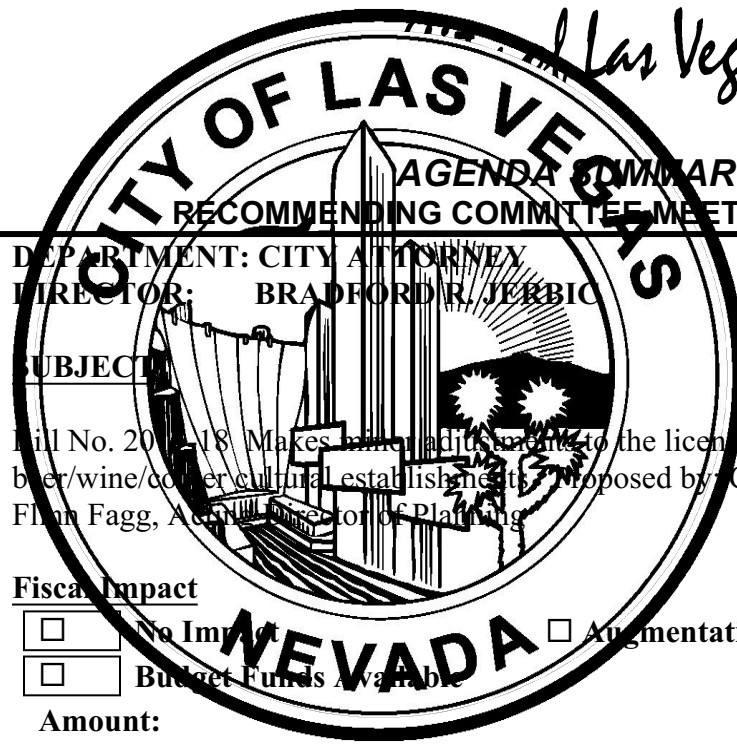

PURPOSE/BACKGROUND:

This bill will make minor adjustments to the licensing and zoning treatment of beer/wine/cooler cultural establishments. The adjustments correspond to recent changes in the zoning regulations and are designed to provide greater flexibility and availability of licensing and zoning approvals. In connection with the greater availability of these approvals, the bill includes a reduction in the license fee and origination fee applicable to these businesses.

This bill should be submitted to a Recommending Committee for review, hearing and recommendation to the City Council for final action.

Minutes:

Prior to declaring the Public Hearing open, COUNCILMAN BARLOW he noted his attendance at the Service Award Ceremony.

CHIEF DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY VAL STEED stated that this bill corresponds to recent changes in the zoning regulations to expand the scope of beer/wine/cooler cultural

establishments. The bill includes a reduction in the license and origination fees for these categories from \$1,000 to \$500. He suggested a First Amendment to authorize the Planning Department to make sure that the changes conform to the new Unified Development Code. He recommended approval.

COUNCILMAN BARLOW asked if this bill covers catering licenses for events held at the World Market Center. CHIEF DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY STEED replied that it would not unless it is part of a museum, performing center/theater, art gallery or art studio.

FLINN FAGG, Acting Director of Planning, added that staff is working on a separate legislation for the World Market Center, as it is different in terms of operation.

COUNCILMAN BARLOW declared the Public Hearing closed.
