Mr. Reilly: There's some themes that surfaced in each of the three discussions. One of those was the issue of communication. This is vitally important to local government. State legislators and local governments share the same constituents.

The other recommendation is how do you personalize it to your own area with your own citizens and with your own legislators to talk about the impacts and issues we are struggling with as a state.

The other theme that came up was a need for further analysis by your own staff, technical staff, and look into opportunities for other reports that have these analysis that can add to this whole discussion.

IX. PUBLIC COMMENT

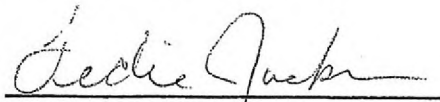
