**PURPOSE/BACKGROUND:**

The city retained a private consultant that worked with representatives of the city and allied public safety agencies to develop a business plan for a proposed regional public safety complex. The proposed components of the project include an emergency operations center (EOC), an intelligence fusion center, a regional 9-1-1 dispatch center and a public safety training center equipped with a low-speed driver's training course.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

The City Manager recommends acceptance of the business plan and authorization to present the project to the Southern Nevada Regional Planning Coalition for further development and to formalize support from other regional jurisdictions.

Minutes:

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CITY MANAGER SELBY stressed that communication has been paramount since the 9-11 incidents.

DEPUTY CITY MANAGER FRETWELL stated that DR. SHEILA CONWAY has done preliminary research on the need for a regional public safety complex. CONGRESSWOMAN SHELLEY BERKLEY helped find monies for the second study, which resulted in a proposed business plan. It is imperative to train, coordinate and be prepared regionally for any disaster, whether it be natural or manmade. She introduced DR. CONWAY, who has been conducting risk assessments for over 20 years and is well respected in the field.

DR. CONWAY indicated that her work with public safety impact assessments led to a greater understanding of where the challenges are. After 9-11, the need for a regional operations center kept resurfacing in meetings. She then gave a detailed PowerPoint presentation, a copy of which is made a part of the minutes, to go over the components. MAYOR GOODMAN suggested to DR. CONWAY that she meet with members of the Southern Nevada Regional Planning Coalition before the next Coalition meeting so that meaningful discussion can be held, as well as to make a presentation to the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority to help bring the private sector into the equation.
