PURPOSE/BACKGROUND:

This bill will provide express authority for taverns located along a pedestrian mall to sell alcoholic beverages through a walk-up window. Such a window would not be available along the right-of-way alignments of Casino Center Boulevard and 4th Street, which carry vehicular traffic.

By way of reading the item, COUNCILMAN BARLOW declared the Public Hearing open.

DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY VAL STEED explained that the current code prohibits alcohol sales through a walk-up window, but the proposed bill contains certain instances where this would be acceptable.

RECOMMENDING COMMITTEE MEETING OF: JUNE 18, 2013

COUNCILMAN BARLOW received clarification from DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY STEED that applicants would still be subject to the approval process; however, businesses with existing tavern licenses that meet the requirements for a window, as disclosed in the proposed bill, would not be subject to a separate approval process.

COUNCILMAN COFFIN received confirmation from DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY STEED that the bill was written so that only the ~~wakeup window~~ was under consideration and that drive-thrus would still be prohibited.

KAREN DUDDLESTEN, Business Licensing Manager, discussed alcohol delivery with COUNCILMAN COFFIN.
