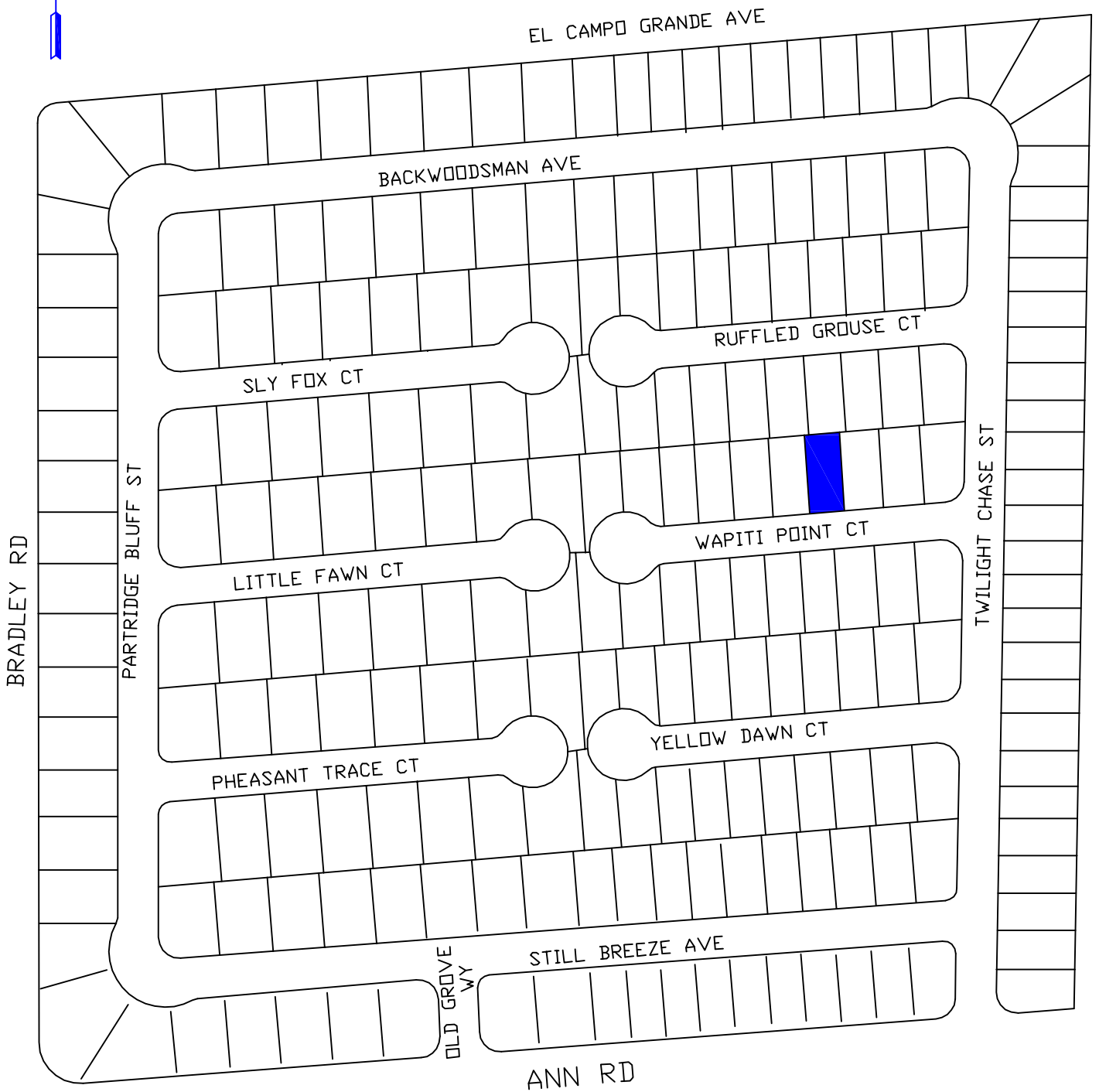
DISCUSSION FOR POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING THE INSTALLATION OF A HANDICAP PARKING ZONE IN FRONT OF 5112 WAPITI POINT COURT (Ward 6 – Ross)

SITUATION

The resident at 5112 Wapiti Point Court is applying for a handicap parking zone in front of her residence to allow for the bus pickup of her disabled daughter who receives curb to curb bus services due to her disabilities. This parking zone will allow the bus to pull directly in front of their home. Other residents park in this area, making it difficult for the bus to pick up her child. One of the residents living across the street is opposed to this parking zone, so we are bringing this item before the Commission for discussion and final action.

RECOMMENDATION

The Traffic Engineering Division approves the installation of the handicap parking zone.

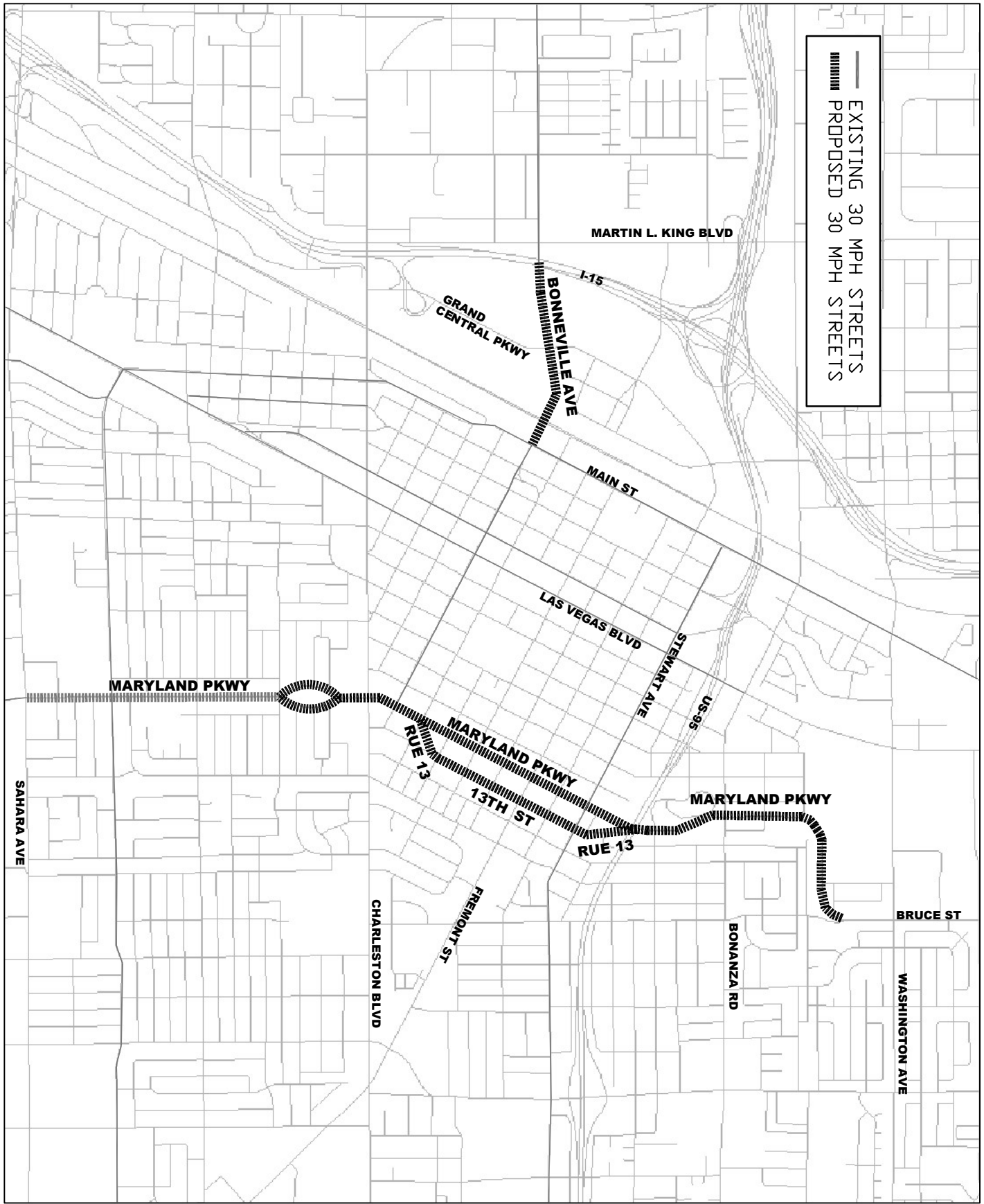
SITUATION

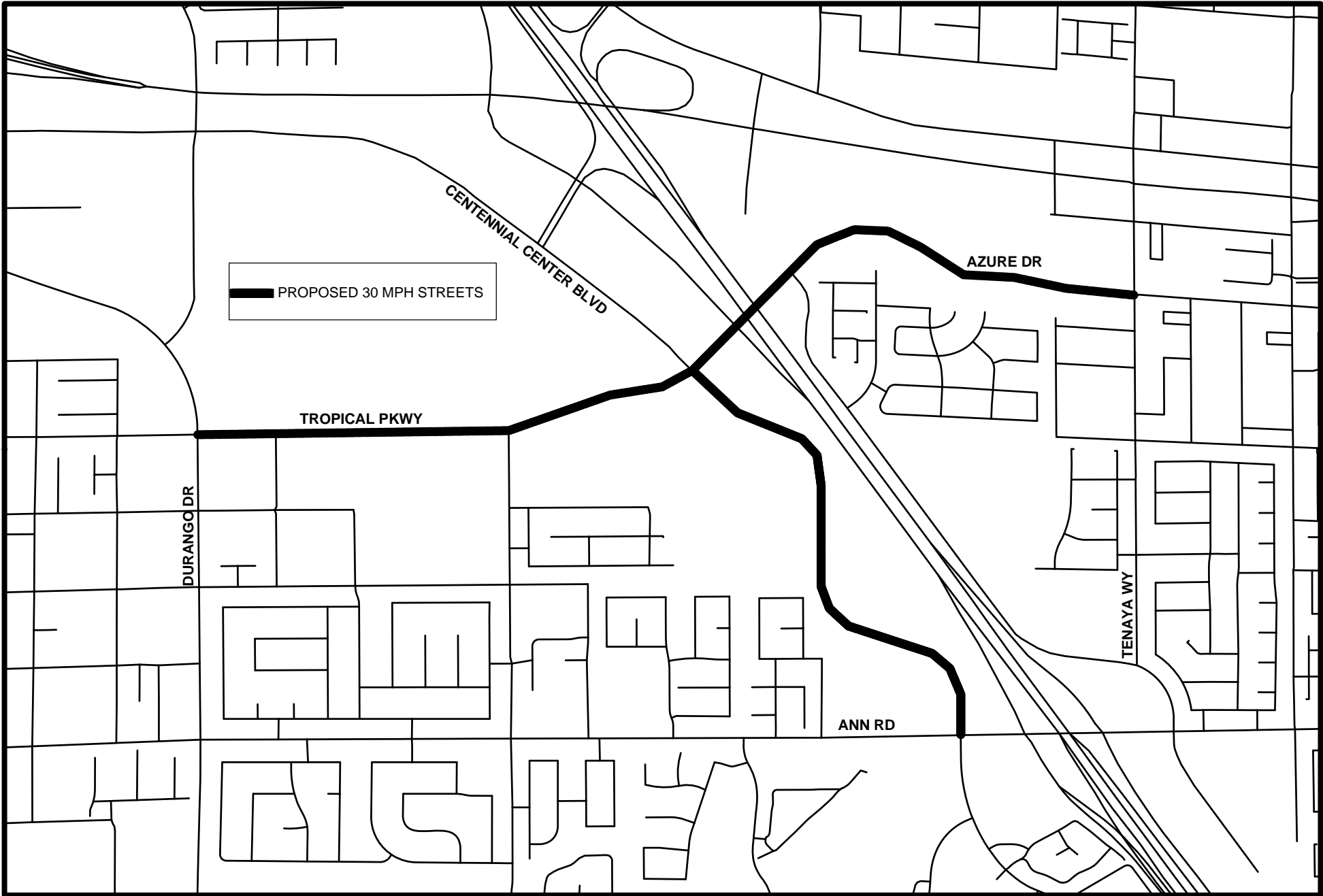
Several speed limit changes have occurred in Ward 1, 3 and 5 as shown below. All of these speed limits will be **30 mph**. Staff is bringing these changes to the Commission and then to City Council for approval to update Traffic Schedule 25-I.

13th Street from Rue 13 to Stewart Avenue – Ward 3
Azure Drive from Centennial Center Boulevard to Tenaya Way – Ward 6
Bonnevill Avenue from I-15 Overpass to Main Street – Wards 1, 3 and 5
Centennial Center Boulevard from Ann Road to Tropical Parkway – Ward 6
Maryland Parkway from Sahara Avenue to Bruce Street – Ward 3
Rue 13 from Clark Avenue to 13th Street – Ward 3
Rue 13 from Stewart Avenue to Maryland Parkway -Ward 3
Tropical Parkway from Durango Drive to Centennial Center Boulevard – Ward 6

RECOMMENDATION

The Traffic Engineering Division recommends approval to add these speed limit changes to Traffic Schedule 25-I.

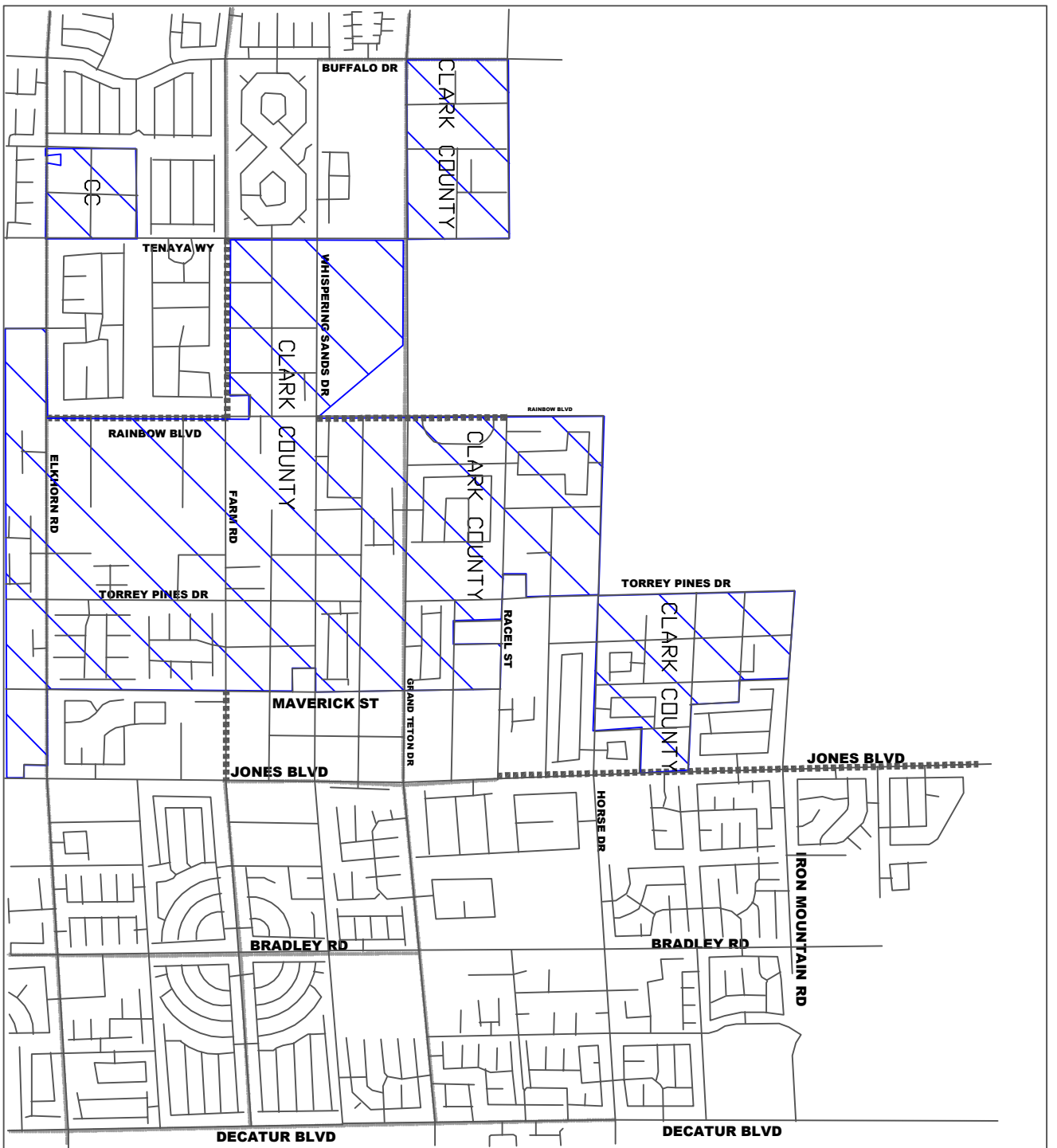
SITUATION

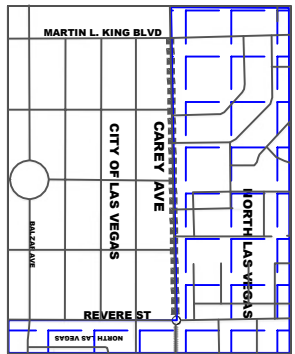
Carey Avenue from Martin L. King Boulevard to Revere Street – Ward 5

Rainbow Boulevard from Elkhorn Road to Farm Road – Ward 6
Rainbow Boulevard from Whispering Sands Drive to Racel Street – Ward 6

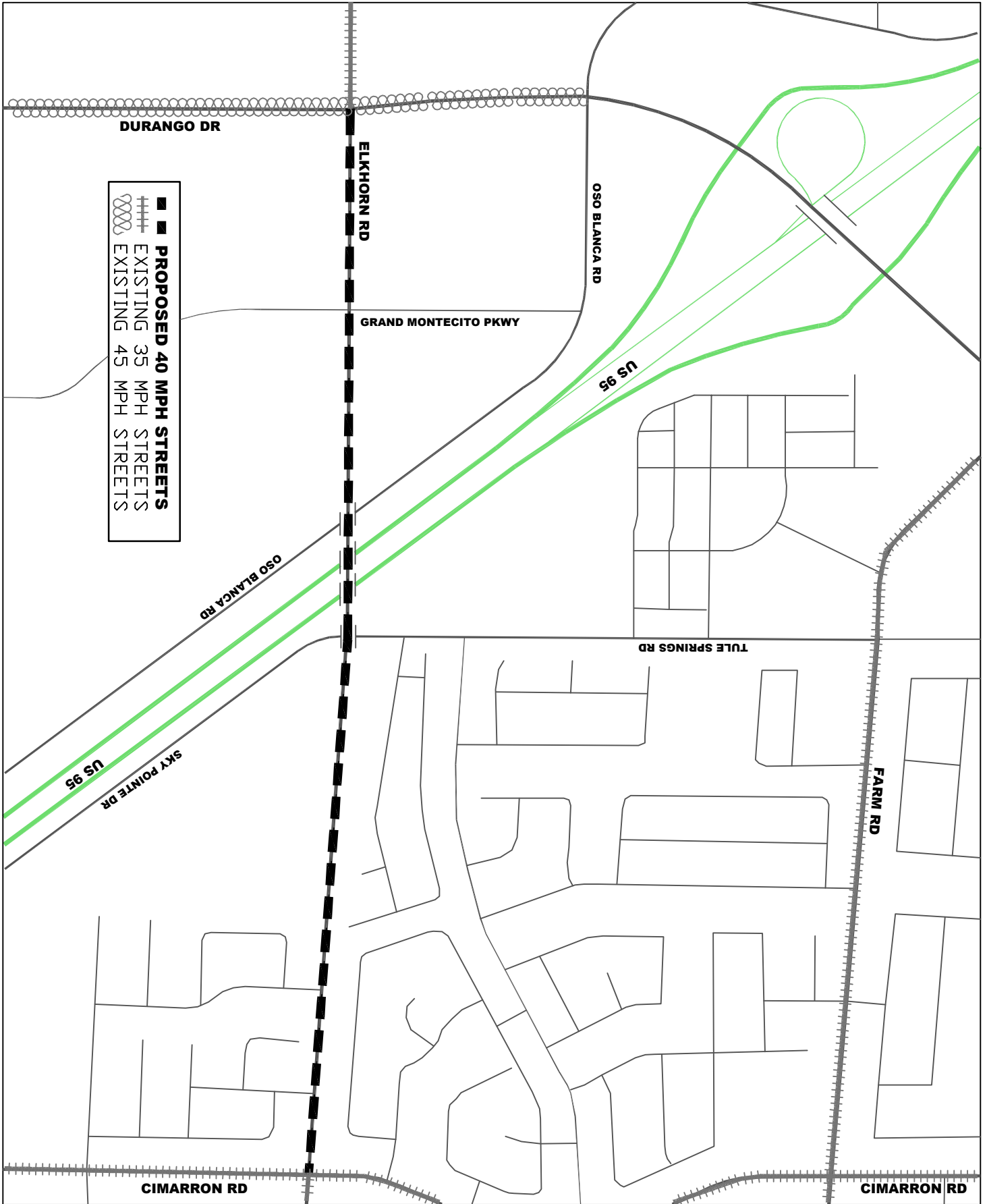
SITUATION

SUBJECT: NEW BUSINESS: ITEM 7

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

The Commission annually elects a Chair and a Vice Chair from among the 7 appointed citizen members. All 9 voting Commissioners are eligible to vote in the election, according to 11.48.040 of the Las Vegas Municipal Code; a majority is required for election.

The Chair has no additional powers compared to the other voting members except to control the meeting. The Chair is not ever a designated spokesperson for the Commission unless specifically so designated by a vote of the Commission. The Vice Chair is to be subsequently elected from the remaining 6 appointed citizen members and serves as Chair in the event that the Chair is absent from the Commission meeting.
