COUNCILMAN BARLOW declared the Public Hearing open.

MARY McELHONE, Planning, and VIRGINIA VALENTINE, Nevada Resort Association, appreciated the meetings conducted with staff and the industry and expressed their support of the ordinance. It was MS. McELHONES opinion that the industry is happy with the proposed amendments.

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DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY VAL STEED outlined the proposed amendments to the ordinance, including the added Section 8; copies were previously distributed to the Councilmen.

COUNCILMAN COFFIN wondered if anyone present from the industry was aware that some games were overlooked in the ordinance. DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY STEED responded that on Page 1, Line 21 of the ordinance, the language any other gaming device covers all gaming devices.

COUNCILMAN BARLOW declared the Public Hearing closed.
