Before the ceremonial items, MAYOR GOODMAN invited Mountain Ridge Little League coach ASHTON CAVE to the podium. MR. CAVE led the Mountain Ridge Little League to the National Championship of the Little League World Series. All of Las Vegas watched as this team made its way through regionals and into the biggest stage in Williamsport, Pennsylvania. This team really brought the community together over the summer and gave Las Vegas something to cheer for.

MR.
