Minutes:

COUNCILMEMBERS BARLOW, BEERS and ROSS announced the various events taking place in their wards on various dates throughout the months of July and August. Some of the councilmembers submitted flyers, which are attached as backup, regarding their events and points of interest.

MAYOR GOODMAN announced that bill numbers 2015-45, 2015-46 and 2015-47 would be heard at the 7/13/15 Recommending Committee meeting.

COUNCILWOMAN TARKANIAN offered the following safety tips for pets: never leave alcoholic drinks unattended as they could poison a pet; do not apply sunscreen or insect repellant to pets that is not labeled specifically for the use on animals as misuse of the product could lead to neurological problems; keep matches and lighter fluid out of reach as they could damage blood cells and result in difficulty in breathing; do not put glow jewelry on pets or allow them to play with it as it can cause excessive drooling and gastrointestinal irritation; keep candles and oil products out of reach as it could cause stomach irritation; never use fireworks around pets as it can result in severe burns and trauma to their face and paws; keep pets in a quiet safe place in the home; remember that the pads of dogs' feet are not thicker than humans, so if it is too hot for human feet, it is too hot for dogs.
