Minutes:

COMMISSIONER MOONEY announced that presenter ROBERT CHATTEL was running late and requested to trail this item.

Subsequent to Items 5 and 6 being heard after Item 10, this item was heard.

COMMISSIONER MOONEY read the staff report included in the backup documentation.

ROBERT CHATTEL, Chattel, Inc., gave a PowerPoint Presentation on an update to the rehabilitation of the Historic Westside School's 1923 and 1948 buildings. He noted the tenants are currently occupying the 1948 building and that a paint analysis was performed. The final decision was made to paint both buildings a green color and refinish the Douglas Fir flooring. The central corridor in the 1923 building is concrete, and new windows have been installed in the 1948 building. The windows of the 1923 building will be retained.

MR. CHATTEL confirmed for CHAIR STOLDAL that the windows in the 1923 building are not the original windows, but the location and size of the windows remained the same.

MR. CHATTEL continued his report and discussed the various signage included in the application which were: Monument Sign, Way Finding Sign, Tenant Signage, Doorway or Door Wall Signs, Dedication Plaques, and Blade or Pedestrian Signs.

CHAIR STOLDAL noticed on the example of the Dedication Plaque that the City Council was listed on the plaque and asked MR. CHATTEL why this was. MR. CHATTEL responded that was the standard for city Dedication Plaques. CHAIR STOLDAL followed up by questioning if the Commission for the Las Vegas Centennial would be recognized on the plaque since it was the funding agency. MR. CHATTEL hoped that there would be a single tall, long plaque that would incorporate CHAIR STOLDAL'S suggested language. CHAIR STOLDAL then asked how the 1923 building would be recognized. MR. CHATTEL confirmed that there was no Dedication Plaque for the 1923 building that exists.

MR. CHATTEL showed several approaches on how the signs might be detailed.

COMMISSIONER LeVINE questioned why the State was suggesting canvas be used for the blade signs and expressed concerns about the wind. MR. CHATTEL responded that he was unsure and that the plan had only been informally reviewed with the State thus far. He explained why the State Historic Preservation Office would review the project.

CHAIR STOLDAL wondered about a rule about attaching signs to buildings on the Historic Register and noted it had something to do with attaching a sign to a historic structure in Fallon, Nevada that was turned into a music hall. MR. CHATTEL recounted an experience with the Mob Museum and its banner signs. With multiple tenants for the current project, there is a need to come up with an appropriate and discrete way of providing identity for tenants and ways to change out the signage that is logical and causes minimal damage. MR. CHATTEL stated that there is a need to have signage on D Street and that his team wanted to come up with a system to easily change out signs.

In response to a query from COMMISSIONER WHITE, COMMISSIONER MOONEY stated that at the Historic Fifth Street School there is signage by every door. She explained the various types and locations of the signs and the concern for visibility of the multiple tenants' identities on the signage.

MR. CHATTEL answered for CHAIR STOLDAL that the proposal for the type of sign could be either metal or wood and noted the concern of wind. He also added that there would be eight signs essentially between each classroom between each window along D Street. COMMISSIONER MOONEY added that a sign would hang to indicate a vacancy.

COMMISSIONER LeVINE clarified that he was not objecting to a Blade Sign.

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COMMISSIONER MOONEY and MR. CHATTEL explained for COMMISSIONER WHITE directions on how she could access the building and where the Dedication Plaques would be located, noting that they were happy to take suggestions on which groups should be identified on the plaques.

The Commissioners and MR. CHATTEL discussed which organizations should be included on the plaques, their locations, sizes and the type of font that should be used.

CHAIR STOLDAL asked for comments from the public.

SAMUEL TOLMAN, Architectural Project Manager, shared his thoughts on the restoration of the Historic Westside School buildings.

CHAIR STOLDAL asked for clarification on what MR. CHATTEL was looking for in the motion from the Commission. MR. CHATTEL answered that he was looking for an approval for the use of solid material for the signs.

Subsequent to the vote, MR. TOLMAN provided details on a recent Request for Proposal bid opening for possible tenants for the Historic Westside School buildings and that due to unresponsiveness from two possible tenants; the building vacancies have been opened to anyone. He stated that there are no other tenants at the present moment except for KCEP.

CHAIR STOLDAL and MR. TOLMAN discussed the boiler at the school.

Minutes:

COMMISSIONER MOONEY read from the staff report attached as backup and discussed the nomination application and the Nevada Register of Historic Places listing processes. The State Historic Preservation Office notifies the property owners and local governments who will solicit for public comment on the proposed nominations. Proposed nominations are reviewed by the Historic Preservation Commission, the State Historic Preservation Office and the Nevada Board of Museums and History, and the length of the process could take up to a minimum of 90 days. For the City of Las Vegas historic property register, an application must be made by the owner. Applications are submitted and reviewed on the next agenda by the Historic Preservation Commission. Once a meeting is held with the Historic Preservation Commission Officer and the owner, the Historic Preservation Commission reviews the application and at the next meeting makes a recommendation for approval or denial after which it is scheduled for the Planning Commission and City Council to hear. If approved by the City Council, the City must receive approval from the Historic Preservation Commission for any work requiring zoning or building permits. Staff recommended approval.

CHAIR STOLDAL asked if the owner does not want to move forward, they can decline moving forward. COMMISSIONER MOONEY confirmed and added that the City would then have to submit the application to the Commission. COMMISSIONER LeVINE asked who within the City would have to submit the application, to which COMMISSIONER MOONEY replied that with others done in the past; applications have typically been signed by the City Manager. DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY JAMES LEWIS pointed out that if there were interested Councilmembers or staff from the City Manager's office, they would speak to CITY MANAGER ELIZABETH FRETWELL and recommend whether or not they should submit the application.

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COMMISSIONER MOONEY stated that the funding is for the nomination and if the nomination report determines that the building is not eligible, the process would not move any further. If it determines that the building is eligible, it would then be determined if the City would like to continue on with the process. She confirmed for CHAIR STOLDAL that the request before them is to add the nomination for the State and City registers and that the funding for the nomination for the National register has already been approved by the Commission. In response to another question by CHAIR STOLDAL, she stated that the National Register nomination does not require the property owner to sign off on the nomination. In the past, the State Historic Preservation Office has had a policy that if the property owner opposes, then the Office will not move forward with the nomination, but she was unclear where that policy currently stands.

CHAIR STOLDAL inquired with COMMISSIONER MOONEY if it has been authorized to hire someone to draft the nomination for the National Register. COMMISSIONER MOONEY asserted that the Commission has authorized her to solicit proposals. She will then return with the proposals and will request the revisions in the budget to allocate funding toward that project based on the proposals then the report process will begin. She confirmed for CHAIR STOLDAL that all nominations will be clumped together. She noted that the criteria are essentially similar.

CHAIR STOLDAL made the assumption that the City Manager could stop the process for the City and State registers but not the National register. COMMISSIONER MOONEY assured him that she would check on that.

DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY LEWIS informed the Commission that the City Council will make the final recommendation on the City register but could not confirm for the State register. COMMISSIONER MOONEY added that the National register process is the same as the State's according to the National Park Service website; if the property owner or the majority of other property owners objects the nomination, the property cannot be listed. She added that anyone can submit a nomination application for the National and State registers, but with the City, the property owner has to submit the application. DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY LEWIS pointed out that this is because the City designation affects property rights and that if a person wants to make changes to a building, they must go through the City first. That is why it is needed for the property owner to submit the nomination application for a property to be put on the City register.

COMMISSIONER MOONEY clarified for COMMISSIONER LeVINE that the current vote is to approve her to seek proposals to complete the nomination report and then once she has the amount, she will return with a revised budget for approval. She hoped to have something available for the Commission by the February 2016 meeting, but it depended on how long it takes to receive some proposals back.

COMMISSIONER MOONEY summarized the staff report attached as backup. She recounted an event in 2005 in which a few Commissioners had attended.

COMMISSIONER MOONEY stated that she will not be attending the subject conference but would reach out to those interested in attending the conference. She clarified for CHAIR STOLDAL that the Commission is voting on the funding for however many Commissioners they desired to send to the conference.

10. [Report by Harrison House, Inc., regarding the status of the Harrison House Historic Preservation Commission Centennial Legacy grant for publications and events celebrating the Pioneer Trail in West Las Vegas Ward 5](#)

Minutes:

DAVID SHARP, President of Harrison House, Inc. provided an update on the grant and stated that a revised budget needs to be submitted. He discussed conversations had with COMMISSIONER MOONEY in regards to the budget and provided details on what the grant money would be used for and asked for any guidance from the Commission.

COMMISSIONER MOONEY provided information on the description of the original grant request and the costs associated with a celebration event. It was discovered money had to be reallocated to different things and she suggested to MR. SHARP to resubmit a revised budget. MR. SHARP confirmed that he would and discussed the changes being made to the event.

CHAIR STOLDAL asked what the goal of the event was. MR. SHARP stated that the goal was to establish an annual Pioneer Trail event for cyclists to explore the city and explained for COMMISSIONER WHITE that the trail will start at the Springs Preserve and will navigate the Pioneer Trail with different stops.

MR. SHARP answered for CHAIR STOLDAL that there would be an initial focus of 200 people in attendance on bikes but hoped for more. He asked for assistance from the Commission in regards to the budget that must be resubmitted.

11. [Report by Department of Planning regarding Las Vegas Historic Sites and Planning Cases interactive map All Wards](#)

Minutes:

This item was heard subsequent to Item 7.

JORGE MORTEO, Senior GIS Analyst, through the use of the City's website, gave a presentation, on the Las Vegas Historic Sites and Planning Cases interactive map. He navigated the website where the Commission can access the interactive map which shows historic areas within Las Vegas and information regarding Site Development Plan Review (SDR) and Special Use Permit (SUP) cases approved within the last year.

TOM PERRIGO, Director of Planning, also gave instructions to the Commissioners on how to use the Meetings and Agendas tab on the City's website so that they may be able to find additional information on the cases scheduled for an upcoming City Council meeting. MR. MORTEO considered including an extra link that would navigate to the appropriate meeting and have access to backup information.

COMMISSIONER MOONEY stated that the content of the website is similar to the information the staff will be presenting to the Commission on a quarterly basis.

MR. MORTEO confirmed for COMMISSIONER RUBINSON that the website is available for public use, who also suggested staff put what the acronyms SUP and SDR mean until details were provided, as she was unsure what the acronyms meant. MR. MORTEO asserted that he will make the change to include the information in the legend on the website.

CHAIR STOLDAL stated that the interactive map worked for him but expressed some confusion he may have regarding accessing historical information. MR. MORTEO clarified that that was a different interactive map and provided a demonstration on where CHAIR STOLDAL could access the information.

MR. MORTEO mentioned the goal of creating a mobile web map to use on smartphone and tablet devices. MR. MORTEO confirmed for COMMISSIONER LeVINE that anyone can access the mobile web app to identify Planning items pertaining to historic sites and added that a link can be added to the Planning website so that the public can more easily find information.

12. [Report by Department of Planning regarding the development of a mobile application for historic, cultural and public art sites All Wards](#)

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Minutes:

COMMISSIONER MOONEY read from the staff report attached as backup and provided a brief summary on a project meeting that was held on January 13, 2016 where discussion was held on the development of a mobile application. She explained why the decision was made for the mobile application to be developed through a web format and discussed the features of the mobile site. The next steps are to set up a meeting with the Office of Communications to ensure their office is comfortable with how the mobile site will function. COMMISSIONER MOONEY has prepared the scope for the research consultant, who will be compiling the list of information that is available, and also doing research on the museums and galleries and compiling the public arts sites to add additional content. In addition, she will submit a revised budget to the State Historic Preservation Office as the cost to complete the mobile site will cost less than a mobile application.

COMMISSIONERS LeVINE and COSGROVE complimented the mobile site and discussed with JORGE MORTEO, Senior GIS Analyst, how the public will access the site and the additions the Department of Information Technologies will be making.

CHAIR STOLDAL asked if the existing content on the mobile site has been vetted. COMMISSIONER MOONEY stated that that has not been done recently but hoped it would be something the researcher will do. DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY JAMES LEWIS asked for clarification on the question in which CHAIR STOLDAL repeated it to emphasize if someone, not just COMMISSIONER MOONEY, has vetted the content of the site. COMMISSIONER MOONEY explained that the content has been pulled from what already existed on the website and discussed the development of the timeline on the mobile site. MR. MORTEO illustrated for CHAIR STOLDAL, using the internet, where he retrieved the information used on the timeline and explained that the descriptions are limited to 254 text characters and he is working with the Department of Information Technologies in order to add additional characters. COMMISSIONER MOONEY added that there will be a link at the bottom of the item on the timeline that will redirect the user to the public website.

In response to a question from CHAIR STOLDAL, COMMISSIONER MOONEY explained that currently the map will contain designated properties, individual properties that have been called out on walking tour brochures and Clark County designated properties. She added that they do not want to include galleries and museums in Clark County but will work with the City's Office of Cultural Affairs to make sure they are as up to date as possible.

COMMISSIONER COSGROVE believed the mobile site will be useful for visitors, will have good educational traction and will be helpful to locals, as well. COMMISSIONER LeVINE added that one does not need an application, only the URL.

CHAIR STOLDAL asked when the project will be complete. COMMISSIONER MOONEY replied that all grant work must be completed by the end of June.

COMMISSIONER MOONEY reported on the Historic Preservation Commission Grant and that the Old Adobe reconstruction is complete, and the next step is to catalog the artifacts and create and install an interpretive sign.

CHAIR STOLDAL complimented COMMISSIONER MOONEY, and COMMISSIONER COSGROVE mentioned the City's tweets about the Old Adobe.

15.

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Discussion regarding topics for future agenda items by the Historic Preservation Commission. Comments made during this portion of the agenda by individual Commission Members shall refer solely to proposals for future agenda items and any discussion shall be limited to whether or not any such proposed item(s) is/are within the purview of the Commission and/or whether such proposed item(s) shall be placed on a future agenda. Minutes:

CHAIR STOLDAL announced that he had two suggestions. The first suggestion was to create a Dorothy Wright Historic Preservation Award, and CHAIR STOLDAL mentioned some of the accomplishments of Dorothy Wright. Second, he admitted that he wasn't sure how to put the item on the agenda but had noticed plaques in the Office of the City Clerk's conference room that contained an incorrect incorporation date for Las Vegas as a city. He wondered if the information was incorrectly recognized throughout the City; he asked DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY JAMES LEWIS if it should be an agenda item. DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY LEWIS responded with a request for clarification on CHAIR STOLDAL'S suggestion. CHAIR STOLDAL clarified that there are two different dates that are generally accepted as the incorporation of Las Vegas as a city; one date is the birth of Las Vegas which was May 15, 1905 which was the auction date, and the other is the date Las Vegas became incorporated as a city with a mayor which was in June of 1911. DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY LEWIS recalled a birthday party that was held celebrating the incorporation of Las Vegas. COMMISSIONER MOONEY confirmed that it celebrated the auction as the birthday of Las Vegas. DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY LEWIS also recalled the Commission discussing several different dates and which one was appropriate. CHAIR STOLDAL stated that it would be nice for the information to be corrected so that people could celebrate the birthdate of Las Vegas in June and not in March.

CHAIR STOLDAL clarified for DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY LEWIS that he would like to pass a resolution reaffirming the date in which Las Vegas became a city. DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY LEWIS suggested the Commission talk about the resolution first before deciding to take any action. CHAIR STOLDAL confirmed, and COMMISSIONER MOONEY verified the verbiage of an agenda item in regards to the correct date of incorporation.
