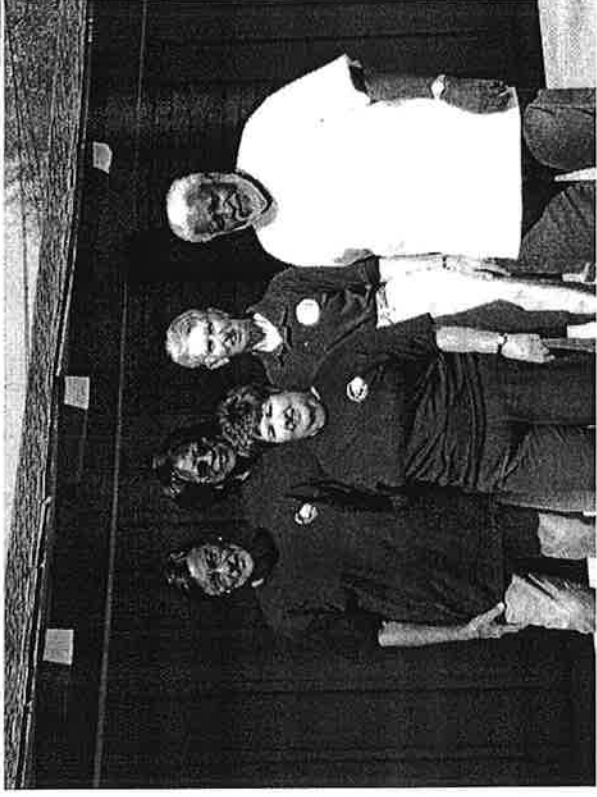

# The Volunteer Responsibilities

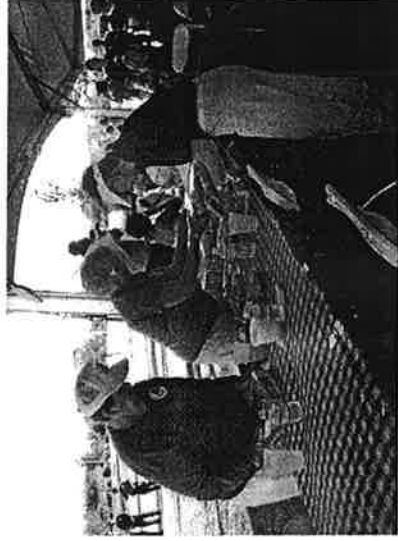


- Daily inspection of assigned city park.

The Park Ambassadors contribute their time and talents on special projects from hospitals to community centers and more.

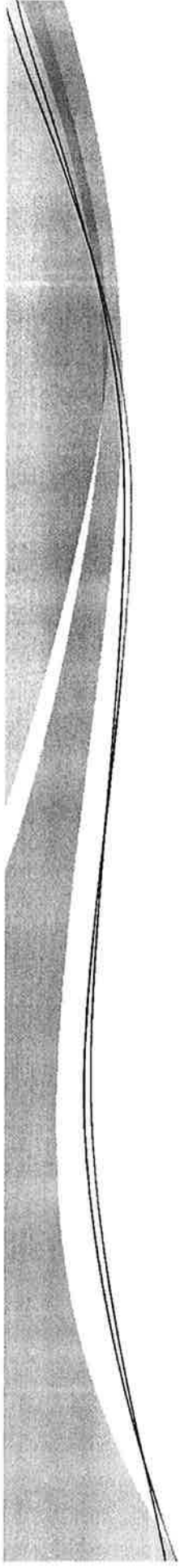

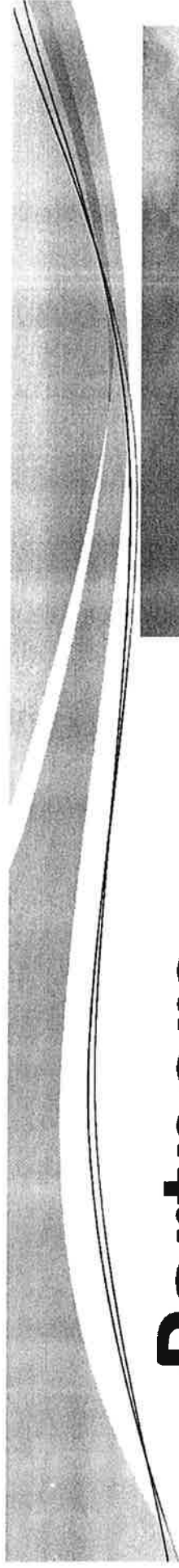

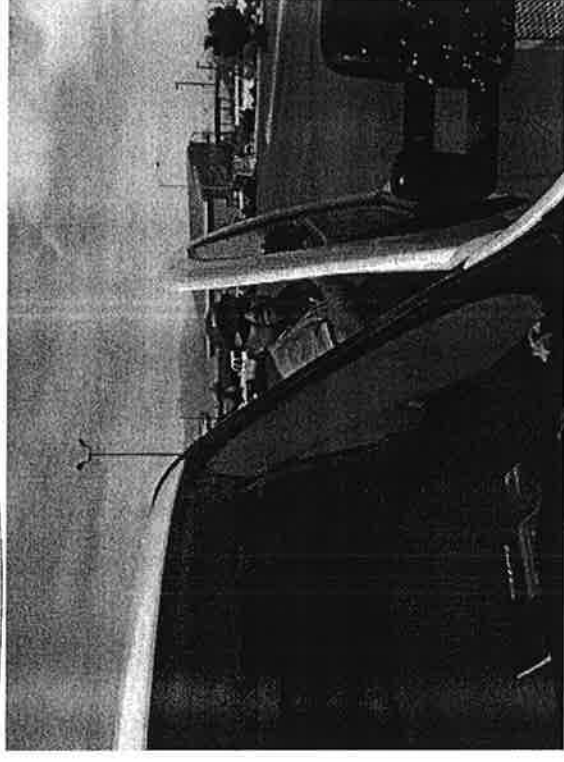
# Benefit to City of Las Vegas

Based on an average of 90 hours per month the savings to the City is \$1,922.40 or \$23,068.20 per year\*\*

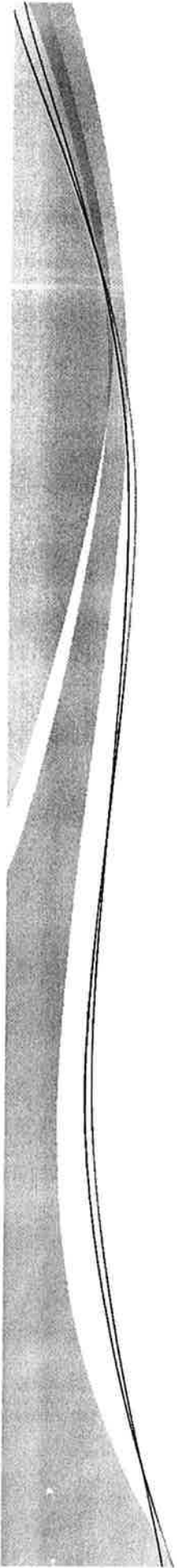
\*\*The volunteer dollar amount is equivalent to \$21.36 per hour (2010 Bureau of Labor Statistics).



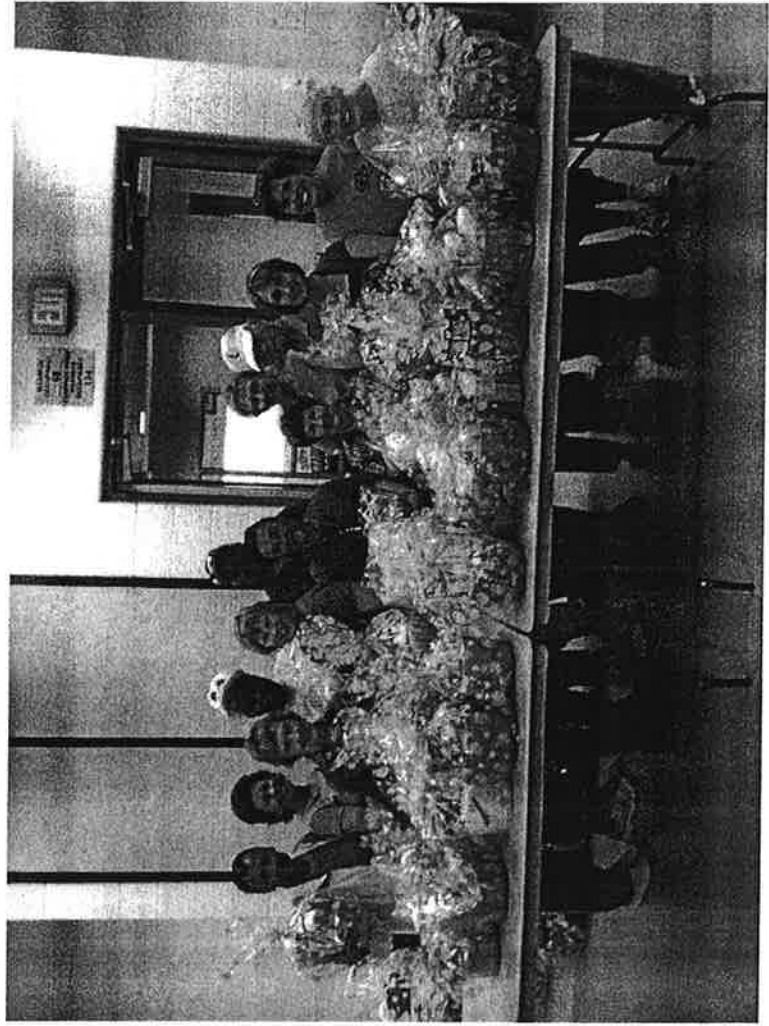
