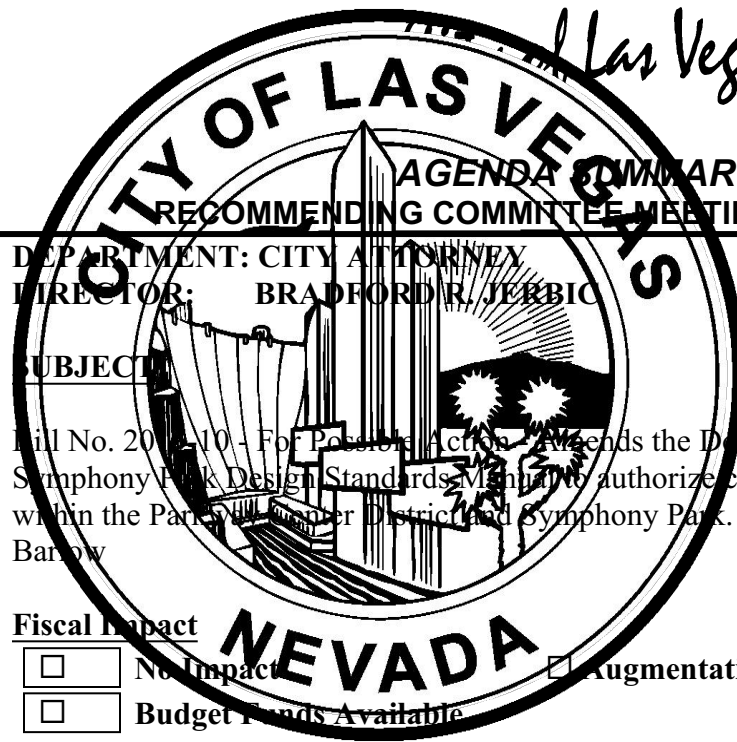

**PURPOSE/BACKGROUND:**

This bill will amend the Downtown Centennial Plan and the Symphony Park Design Standards Manual to authorize commercial recreation/amusement uses within the Parkway Center District and Symphony Park. The occasion for the bill is the possibility of a stadium in Symphony Park, but the bill's primary purpose is to make the permitted uses language of the Downtown Centennial Plan and the Symphony Park Design Standards consistent with that used in the City's Unified Development Code.
