PURPOSE/BACKGROUND:

NRS Chapter 271A authorizes municipalities to create tourism improvement districts within their respective jurisdictions in order to encourage economic development and development related to tourism. In accordance with State law, this bill will formalize the creation of a tourism improvement district within the area referenced in the summary above.

Minutes:

COUNCILMAN BARLOW declared the Public Hearing open.

BILL ARENT, Director of Economic and Urban Development, stated that this item is scheduled for a second reading at the April 1, 2015 City Council meeting and a final reading at the April 15, 2015 City Council meeting. This item is time sensitive and he wondered if it could still be
