Minutes:

ARNOLD STALK, Mr. Stalk in support of Item 10. He commended the Mayor, Council and staff for helping the homeless. He wished to see the private sector be a part of the effort.

MAURICE DONNELL COOPER expressed his frustration finding a job and asked for the Mayor and Council's help. MAYOR GOODMAN indicated that MR. COOPER lives within Clark County. COUNCILMAN BEERS provided MR. COOPER with the phone number for Workforce Connections.

OFFICERS MEL FRAILEY and JOHN PURCELL, Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department, stated that they were with the Multi-agency Outreach Resource Engagement (M.O.R.E.) Project and offered to provide MR. COOPER with some assistance.

MARIO PAWLIK expressed concerns regarding Airbnbs and short-term rentals. He did not believe more regulation would solve the problem. COUNCILWOMAN TARKANIAN informed MR. PAWLIK that this item would be heard at the Recommending Committee meeting of May 15th. She agreed with MR. PAWLIK'S concerns and did not understand why a business is allowed in a residential district. She added that there will be a vote on the new ordinance, which will require a special use permit, the first week in June.

VALERY GODINO gave comments on Item 16 and third party badging. COUNCILMAN ROSS said that Item 16 could be pulled from the Consent Agenda; however, the item is only for a Business Impact Statement and wished for it to remain as is.

JANELLE MAZZA indicated that she lives in the John S. Park Neighborhood and successfully runs two, short-term property rental businesses. She thanked the Mayor and Council for bringing attention to the matter and for allowing successful, respectful businesses to thrive.

ANTHONY CASABIANCA gave an update on his housing situation.

MARIANNE LUKE (phonetic) spoke in favor of Item 40 as she lives near the Corridor of Hope and the courtyard would help the homeless.
