MAYOR GOODMAN called forward and recognized PAT SKORKOWSKY, Clark County School District (CCSD) Superintendent. MR. SKORKOWSKY spent the last 30 years as an educator in the CCSD. He served as a Teacher, an Assistant Principal, a Principal, an Academic Manager, a Deputy Superintendent and a Superintendent. He started his career at C.C. Ronnow Elementary School in 1988 after moving from Oklahoma upon graduating. At Ronnow, he developed the teaching philosophy that drives the nation's largest school district, the idea that we can reach "every student in every classroom, without exception, without excuses."

MR. SKORKOWSKY has been the greatest of partners with the City of Las Vegas working to better the education system for the children and he will soon be retiring. She expressed appreciation for his years of service and looked forward to seeing what he would do next.
