Minutes:

ROUSSAN YOSHUA COULAS, Las Vegas resident, reiterated his moral and religious beliefs. MEMBER TARIANIAN received confirmation from CITY MANAGER ELIZABETH FRETWELL that staff will be briefing City Councilmembers on homeless issues.

KATHERINE DUNCAN, Las Vegas resident, thanked the Redevelopment Agency for their efforts. She voiced concern that the report neither indicated the actual number of jobs created nor issues surrounding the F Street closure.

STANLEY WASHINGTON, Las Vegas resident, stated he did not hear enough about who the Redevelopment Agency is supposed to be benefitting. DAVID RIGGLEMAN, Director of Communications, confirmed that the ribbon cutting for the new City Hall is March 5, 2012, at 6:00 p.m. CITY MANAGER FRETWELL clarified for the public's benefit there will not be a meeting at the Doolittle Community Center on March 5, 2012 due to the grand opening of City Hall.

ANTHONY HODGES, Las Vegas resident, reminded the audience that Highway 95 is controlled by the State and federal government and implored citizens to drop the subject and stop complaining about street closures due to that project.

STEVE BURDOCK, Las Vegas resident, received clarification from MEMBER ROSS that the City Council meeting will be held immediately following the Redevelopment Agency meeting.
