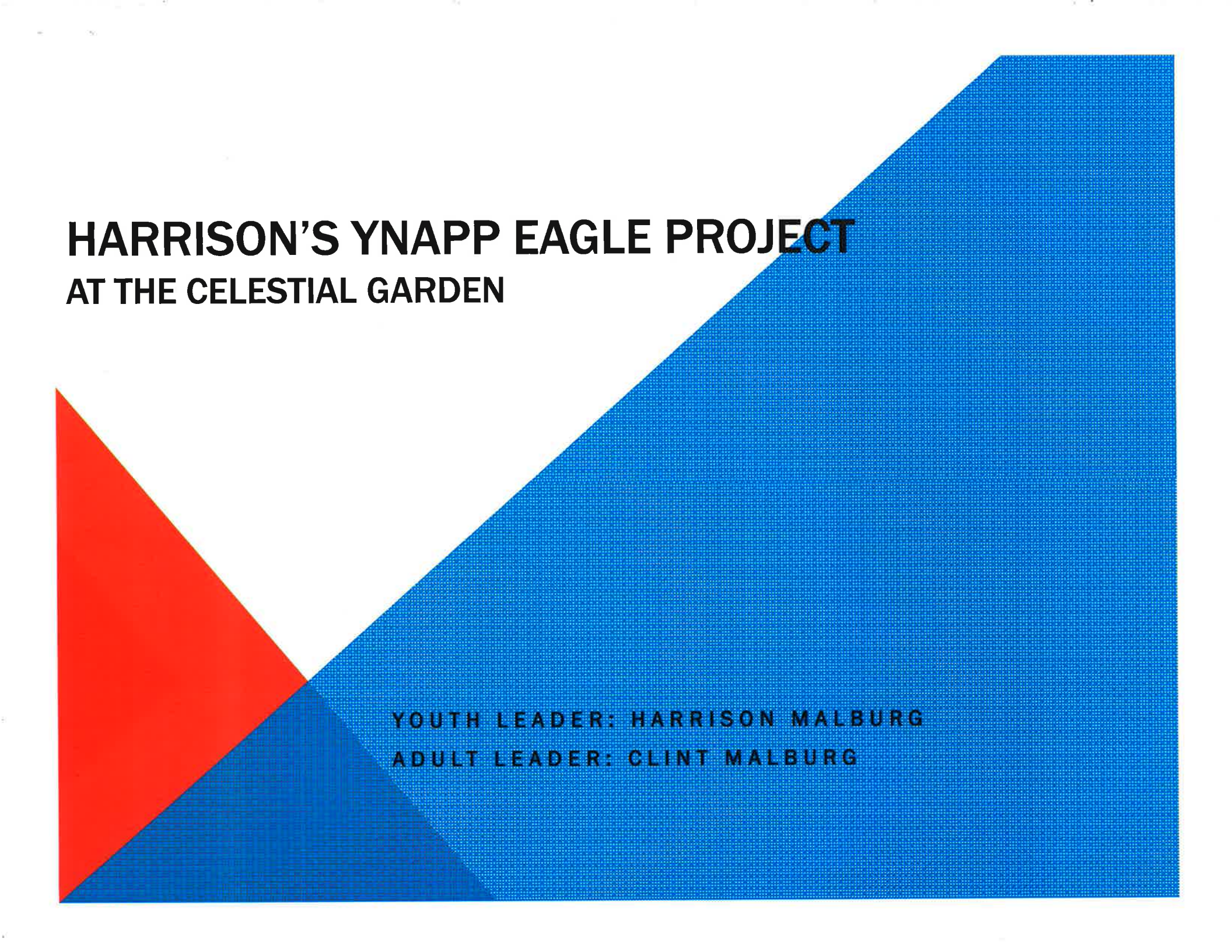

AT THE CELESTIAL GARDEN

MY PROJECT

Where?

- Centennial Hills Active Adult Center Celestial Community Garden

What am I doing?

- I will be adding a large garden bed along with a smaller herb garden and painting murals on two block walls

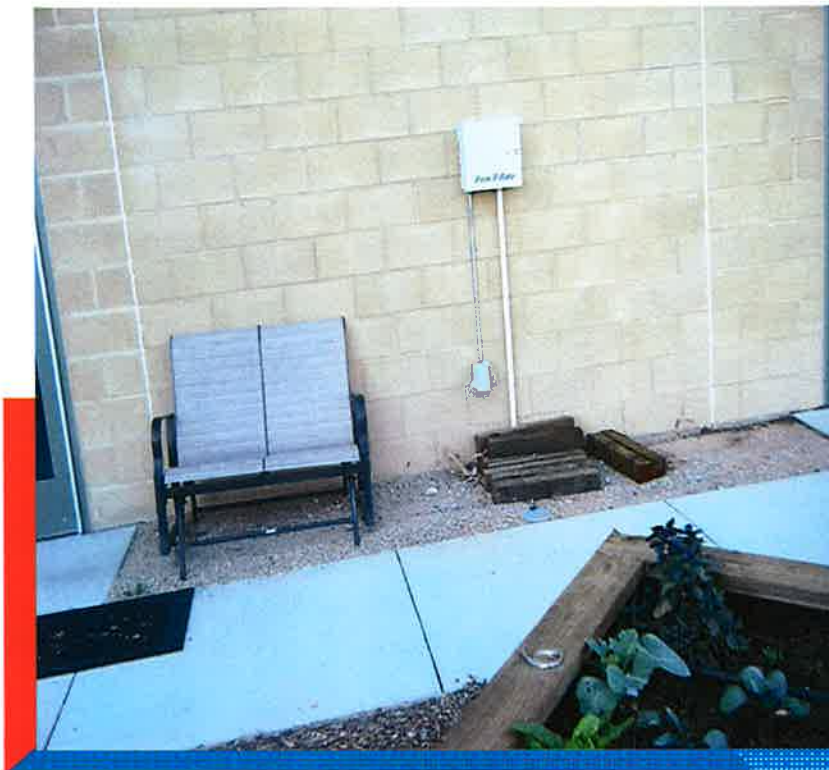
How?

- This bed will be off the side walk with bricks stacked two high to keep the dirt contained
- The planter will have 4 inches of top soil and will be separated with decorative stone



MY PROJECT (CONT'D)

- The herb garden will be made like the other existing beds, with pressure treated wood, lined with plastic, and filled with top soil
- There are two blank block walls that I will be adding murals too
- There is also a picnic table that I will be placing artificial grass and weed block



HOW WILL THIS BENEFIT THE COMMUNITY?

My project will benefit the community by allowing more senior citizens and adults with disabilities to come together and socialize and learn about gardening

It will also allow the people who choose to participate to get moving and get their hands dirty while meeting new people

WHY DID I CHOOSE THIS PROJECT?

I am in the process of earning my Eagle Scout Rank, the highest rank in Boy Scouts and my grandma told me that the community garden was looking to expand and I know my grandma enjoys spending time there

When this community garden was started I helped my grandma build her garden and the remaining beds

This project will be the community service project I need in order to reach the Eagle Scout Rank



WHY IS THIS PROJECT IMPORTANT?

This project is important because it allows more people to participate in the garden and provide a community sense in what they have accomplished



WHAT NEEDS TO BE DONE?

Gather donations and materials

Paint the murals

Make the planters

Seal the planters and fill them with soil

Lay down the artificial grass

Clean everything up



WHO WILL DO THIS?

I am currently an active Boy Scout apart of Troop 99 in Las Vegas

There are about 35 active scouts who are willing to help along with their parents

Our troop does several Eagle Projects and there is always about 25 boys at each project and about 15 parents



HOW MUCH MONEY DO I NEED?

I need a minimum of 850\$ dollars to complete this project

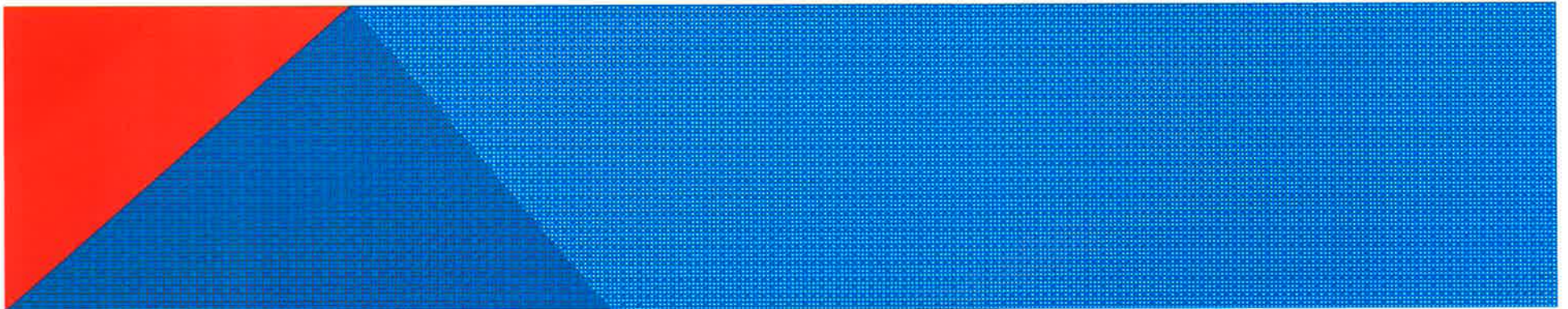
1000\$ dollars will allow me to get the better material

- i.e.- better brick, more brick to build a water barrier around the existing mulch (to prevent damage done by the rain), more top soil to add to the existing planters before the planting season, more food for the volunteers

I am able to utilize tools from my troop since we have done so many service projects

My adult leader used to work construction and has several tools that will be available for my project

This money will include all of the materials, any rental tools, and food for the volunteers



HOW WILL YOUTH AND ADULTS WORK TOGETHER?

Youth and Adults will work together as a group to teach one another new skills and provide assistance to each other when needed

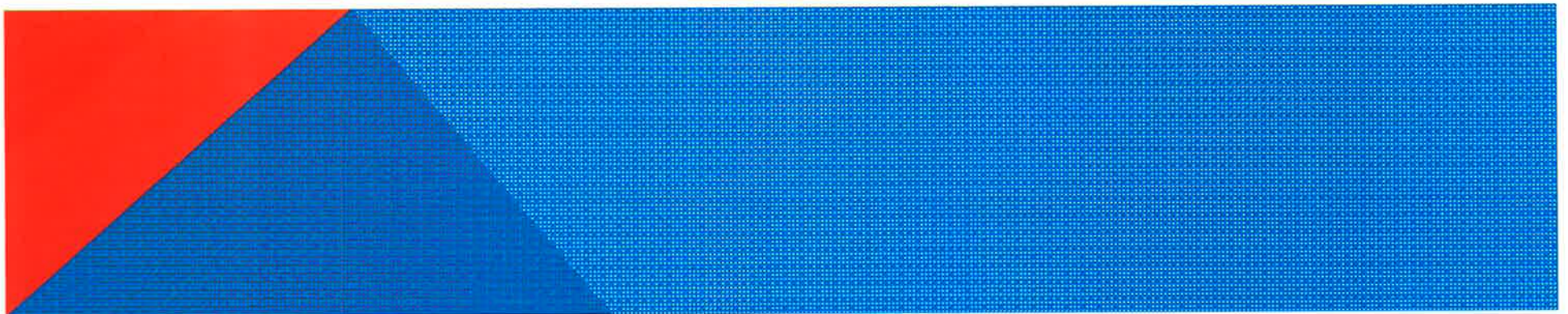


SOME REFLECTIONS IDEAS

This is something I enjoy doing with my grandma and I get to spend quality time with her

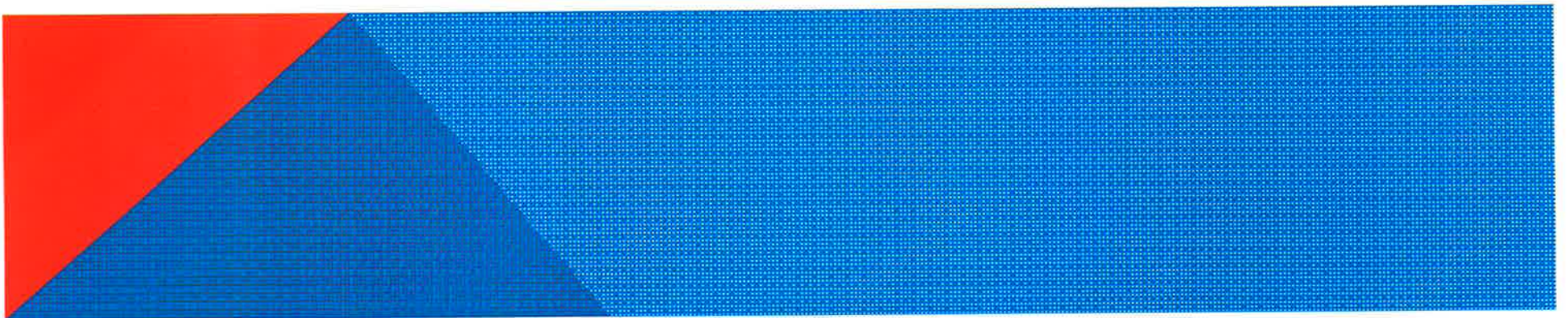
If there ever comes a time that the garden needs some maintenance or fixing, I will ask my troop to help me fix the garden so the Adult Center can continue to enjoy it
