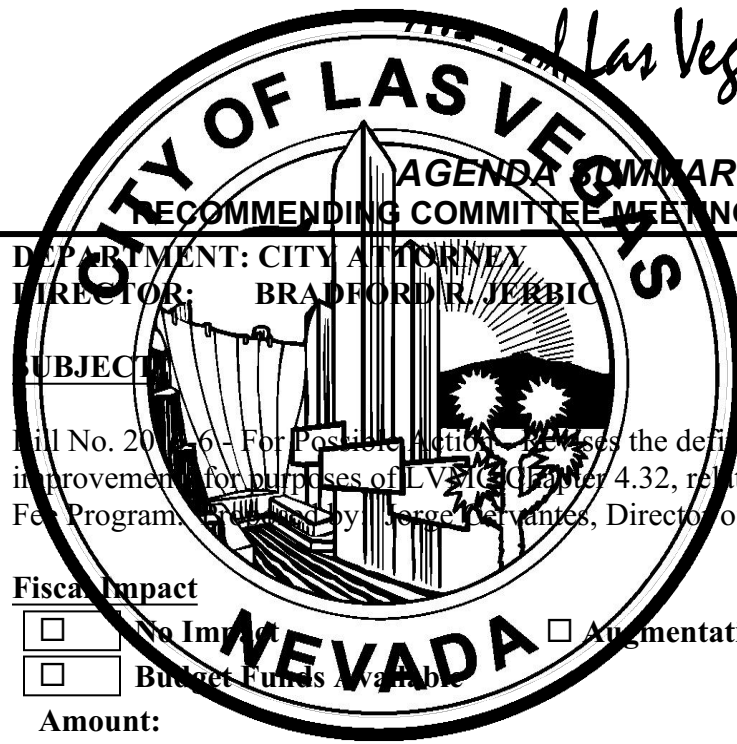

By way of reading the item, COUNCILMAN BARLOW declared the Public Hearing open.

JORGE CERVANTES, Director of Public Works, provided a brief overview of what is included in the definition of traffic signal system improvements.

COUNCILMAN BARLOW asked MR. CERVANTES to discuss his thoughts about cameras on traffic signals. MR. CERVANTES explained that there is a current Nevada Revised Statute that prohibits the use of cameras to issue traffic citations. There is a push nationwide to get rid of

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these and many communities are removing these cameras. MR. CERVANTES then provided an overview of the two types of cameras in use and their purposes.

COUNCILMAN COFFIN received confirmation from MR. CERVANTES that other agencies could access the real-time web feed to record the video if they have that capability.

COUNCILMAN BARLOW announced that Bill 2013-5 would be eligible for adoption on February 20, 2013, and Bill 2013-6 would be eligible for adoption on March 6, 2013.

By way of reading the next item, COUNCILMAN BARLOW declared the Public Hearing closed.
