MAYOR GOODMAN declared the Public Hearing open.

SENIOR DEPUTY FIRE CHIEF THOMAS MIRAMONTES indicated the bill was not from Las Vegas Fire and Rescue and they were opposed to moving it forward.

DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY VAL STEED believed that because Bill Nos. 2017-19 and 2017-20 were both about fire sprinklers, the City Manager may have felt that they should be heard together. He noted one of the bills was from a pro-sprinkler direction and the other was not.

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COUNCILMAN COFFIN asserted that he could not support the bill since it is contrary to the previous bill.

MAYOR GOODMAN declared the Public Hearing closed.
