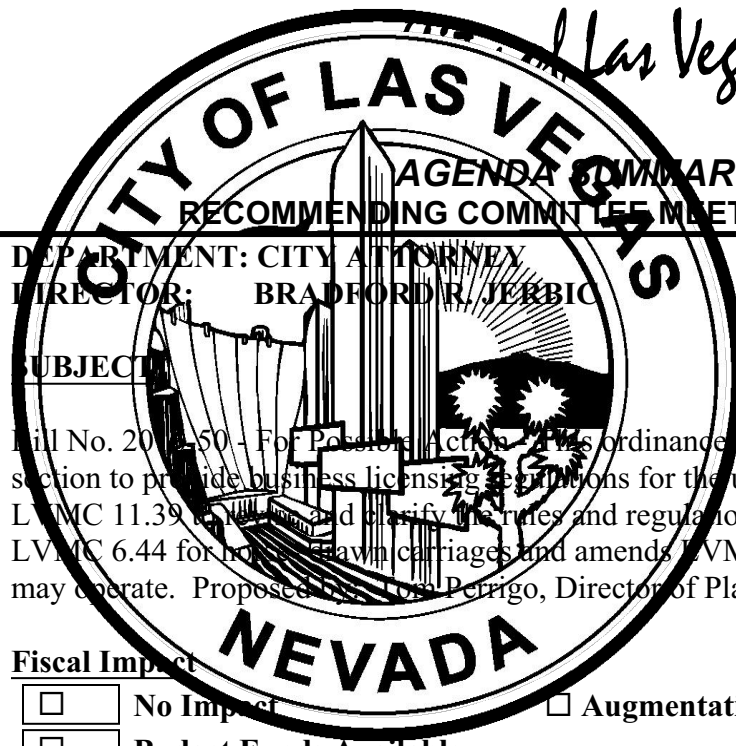

PURPOSE/BACKGROUND:

This bill will amend LVMC Title Six to add a new section to provide business licensing regulations for the use of pedicabs and pedalbuses, amends LVMC 11.39 to revise and clarify the rules and regulations for pedicabs and pedalbuses, amends LVMC 6.44 for horse-drawn carriages and amends LVMC 11.02 to clarify where such vehicles may operate.

Minutes:

COUNCILMAN BARLOW declared the Public Hearing open.

COUNCILMAN BARLOW indicated that he and COUNCILMAN COFFIN have received numerous emails regarding the proposed bill. He requested that this bill not be considered until the issues expressed in the emails are resolved. He suggested this item be held in abeyance so he

and COUNCILMAN COFFIN could meet with staff to discuss the issues. TOM PERRIGO, Director of Planning, stated that staff also received input emails and agreed to the abeyance to give all parties an opportunity to gain a better understanding of the proposed bill.

COUNCILMAN COFFIN asked if anyone has expressed interest for the pedicab business and if a delay may cause a problem. KAREN DUDDLESTEN, Deputy Director of Planning, replied that companies are anxious to start in the downtown area and have contacted Business Licensing asking about the proposed ordinance; however, she did not see representations from any of those businesses present at this meeting.

MR. PERRIGO asked that COUNCILMAN BARLOW and COFFIN forward the emails to him so staff can follow-up. MS. DUDDLESTEN added that staff will have a meeting with those who have provided input. COUNCILMAN BARLOW indicated that the main concern was about horses. COUNCILMAN COFFIN added that it might be a matter of cleaning up the language; those who sent emails would prefer not to have horses at all.

COUNCILMAN BARLOW declared the Public Hearing closed.
