REMARKS: A portion of this site is located in a FEMA Special Flood Hazard Area, Zone AE. No mapping changes to the Flood Zone are proposed to be submitted to FEMA with this development.

The Drainage Study for the subject project has been reviewed and:

- Flood Control will not recommend FEMA review and approval based upon the flood zone impacts. The provided HEC-RAS analysis shows negligible changes from the existing model to the proposed condition. Minor changes are shown to cross sections that were added into the model. The overall effect to the mapped flood zone is negligible. No structures are proposed within the FEMA Flood Zone.
- The existing public drainage easement (privately maintained) shown on Parcel Map File 111, Page 0012 for the eastern portion of the site is to remain. The Flood Zone is within this easement area and this easement cannot be vacated.
- The new 10'-wide public drainage easement (privately maintained) along the southern boundary must be granted and recorded by separate document prior to the final acceptance of the improvement plans.
- No improvements are proposed within the NDOT right-of-way for *Rancho Drive*.

In an effort to increase administrative efficiency, the City of Las Vegas Public Works Department requires all soil reports, drainage studies and traffic impact analysis submittals to be accompanied by an electronic copy of the submittal. Electronic documents must be submitted with one original hard copy of the study. Electronic documents should be on a universal computer-readable digital output replicating your submittal to be used for archival or display purposes. This may be more than one file if necessary. An Indexed Portable Document Format (PDF) or Print Ready CAD file formats with a minimum of 300dpi are the desired formats, but provided it is a high quality digitized replication of the submittal, other formats may be acceptable. If figures are in color, they must be scanned in color and saved as a separate file. The new submittal requirement is effective on July 1, 2011. If there are any questions regarding these new requirements, please contact Robert Welch in the Flood Section at (702) 229-2177 or Rick Schroder in Traffic Engineering at (702) 229-6327.

NOTE: Any future changes to the proposed design (or design assumptions) as outlined in the approved drainage study and attached preliminary grading plan which affect drainage must be addressed in a Drainage Study Amendment and accepted by the *City of Las Vegas Flood Control Section*. Additionally, conditional acceptance of a drainage study is valid for a period of one (1) year. If the proposed construction has not been completed in that time period, the *City of Las Vegas* reserves the right to require additional conditions and/or submission and acceptance of a complete drainage study update prior to further construction of a project.

NOTE: Please be advised that all land surface area disturbances over 1 acre or any area adjacent to a water way must submit to the *Nevada Division of Environmental Protection* a "Notice of Intent" to discharge that certifies a stormwater pollution prevention plan has been developed and is maintained on site; for inclusion in the Stormwater General Permit No. NVR100000. A phased construction unit in a contiguous subdivision is considered under construction until all stripped or disturbed surface areas have been covered by paving, building construction or planting. NOTES: This drainage study assumes that the project will be constructed in one phase. If improvement plans are submitted to break the project into separate phases, a drainage study update will be required for each phase addressing the interim condition.

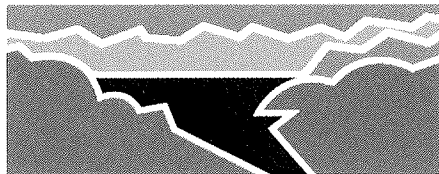

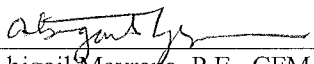

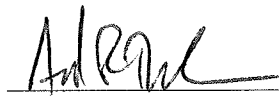
District concurs with acceptance of this Technical Drainage Study by City of Las Vegas Public Works.

District's review of this project was limited to issues of Regional Flood Control Significance as defined in *Uniform Regulations for the Control of Drainage*. As noted in study, site resides in a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) designated as "Zone AE" per the effective Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM). Therefore, consultant should be advised that this acceptance does not serve to amend the FIRM or remove the SFHA.

Please be aware that as additional information becomes available and/or restudies of Flood Insurance Studies are performed, information submitted by SLATER HANIFAN GROUP may be superseded.
