  - A request for additional Capital Improvement Project funding (\$150,000.00) was submitted in on 10/28/19 for improvements, maintenance, and conservation efforts for the *Paintbrush Gateway* sculptures. This request is under review, with final determinations to be issued in the springtime.
  - Regularly observing and assessing the city’s permanent art collection and addressing any additional maintenance issues as they arise.
- 12/19/19 – The *Rainforest* mural has been installed (\$11,496.00)
  - Condition reporting and general graffiti abatement has been conducted on multiple AMP projects.
  - Condition reporting has been conducted for the Berkley Square banners; additional banners and pole hardware to be installed.
  - Condition reporting is underway for the Pioneer Trail; additional banners and directional signage to be installed.
  - Regularly observing and assessing the city’s permanent art collection and addressing any additional maintenance issues as they arise.
- 10/17/19 – The *Rainforest* mural tiles have been delivered to Fire Station # 3 and are to be installed (\$11,496.00).
  - The *Fire Hose Art* sculpture has been installed at Fire Station # 3.
  - The bronze portion at the *Firefighters Memorial Monument* is to be cleaned and waxed (Cost TBD).
  - Regularly observing and assessing the city’s permanent art collection and addressing any additional maintenance issues as they arise.
- 09/19/19 – The *Snowball in Vegas* sculpture has been fully repaired and restored to its original location (\$6,696.64).
  - Damaged slate has been repaired at the *Southern Nevada Law Enforcement Memorial* (\$430.00).
  - Tiles are currently being printed for the *Rainforest* mural replacement at Fire Station # 3 (\$11,496.00).

-Efforts are underway to repair the bronze sculpture, sculpture plaque, and foundation at AnSan Sister City Park, which has deteriorated rapidly (cost TBD). The sculpture is to be considered for accessioning into the collection at the 12/19/19 Arts Commission meeting.
- 09/19/19, 10/17/19, 11/21/19 – Digital Design LLC has provided a quote to repair the F-22 sculpture at Raptor Park (\$24,750.00).  
-Digital Design LLC has provided a quote for a 10-year maintenance plan (\$46,000.00).

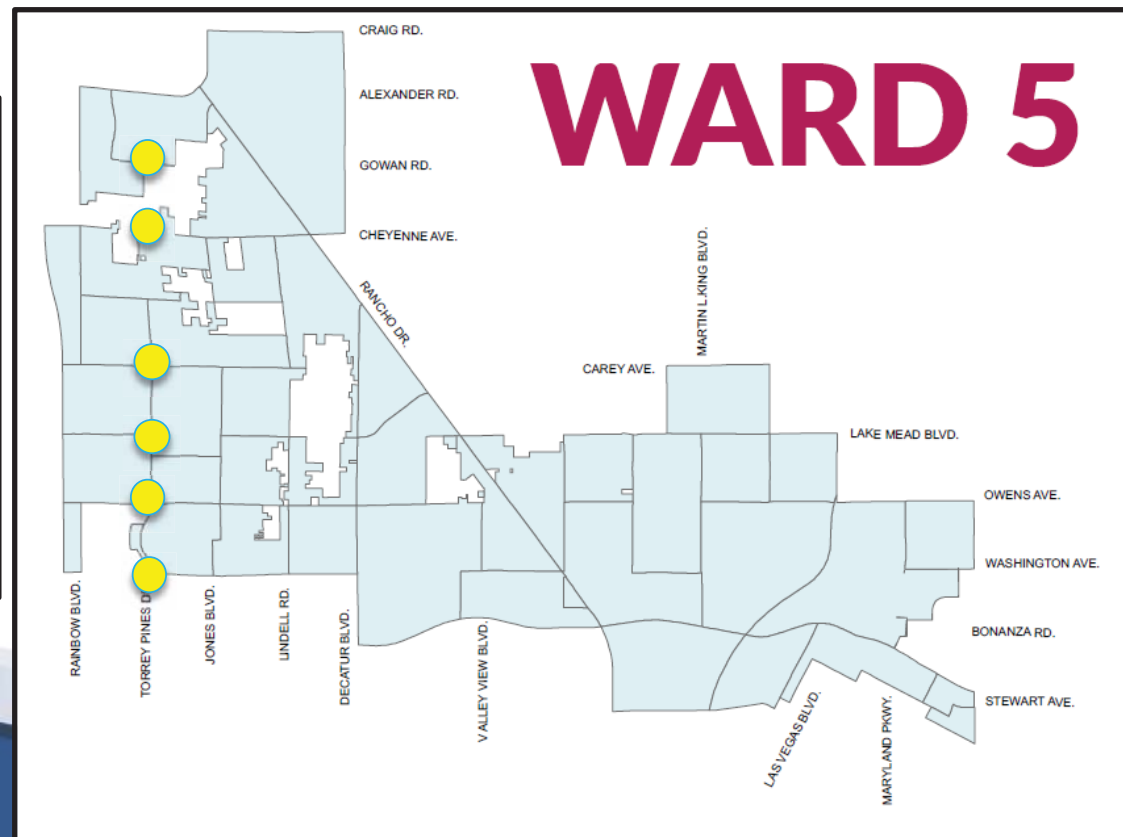


# AMP Torrey Pines (Ward 5)

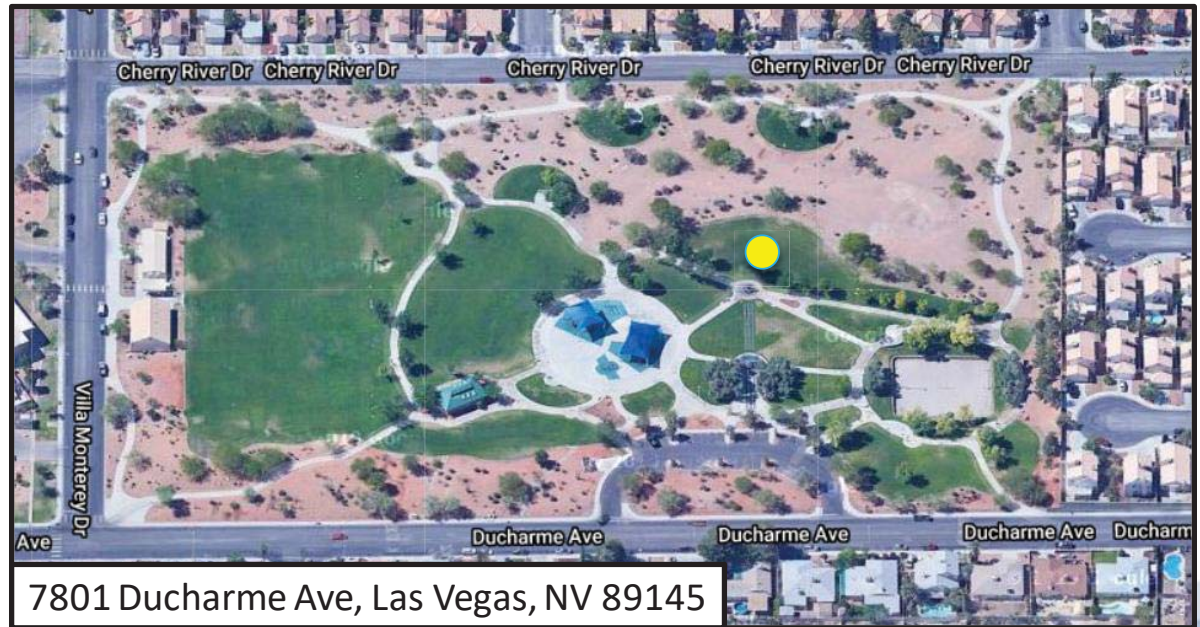

# AnSan (Ansan/An San) Sister City Park

Built in 1994, the park is named after AnSan City in South Korea and includes an eight-foot-tall statue of a popular Korean children's character. 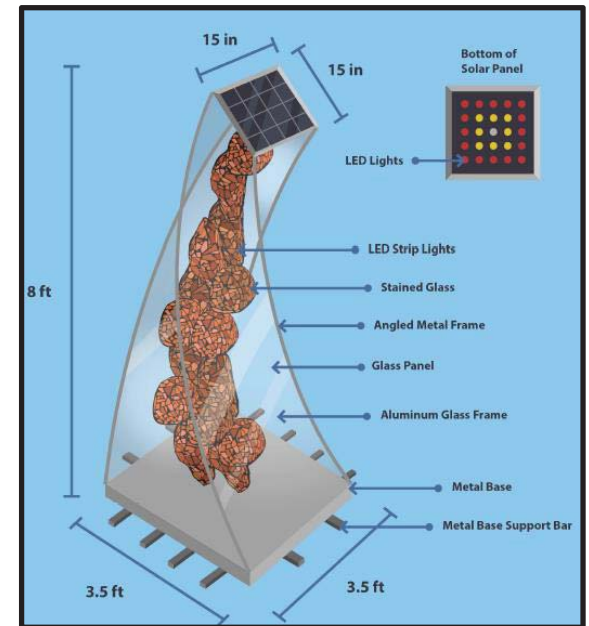

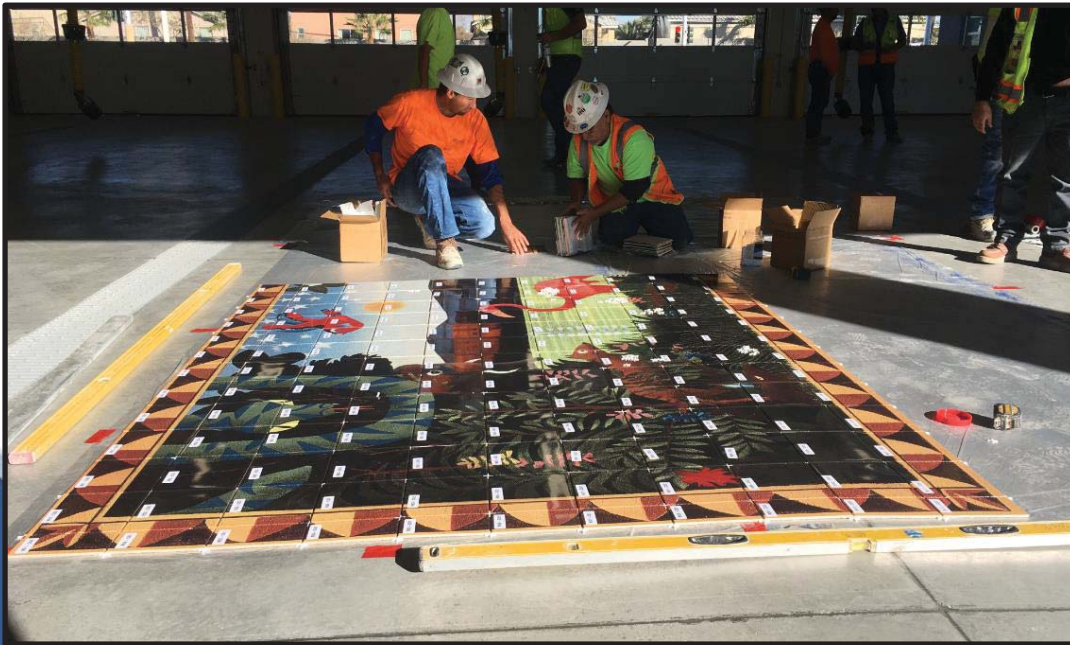

# Project Neon Public Art
