SUBJECT:

HPC-77003 – Report by the Office of Community Services regarding the Lead Hazard Control and Healthy Homes Grant.

PURPOSE:

Angela Washington, Grant Program Coordinator, Office of Community Services, will report on the Lead Hazard Control and Healthy Homes Grant program and some of the recipients of the grant.

BACKGROUND:

The grant is a federally funded program that provides funding for lead abatement through the rehabilitation of homes and educational opportunities to support homeowners. The program is a collaborative effort between the City of Las Vegas and the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, Department of Environmental and Occupational Health. The program targets four key zip codes in Las Vegas (89101, 89106, 89107, 89108) that are known to contain the oldest housing stock and the highest likelihood of lead-based paint hazards, as well as those that contain units that are home to high risk populations, including young children, racial/ethnic minorities, and low income/underserved persons.

The Office of Community Services has been regularly consulting with the State Historic Preservation Office on those sites that are 50 years of age or older and that require rehab activities that do not appear on the exemption list contained in the City's memorandum of understanding with SHPO. In an effort to inform the public and the HPC, the Office of Community Services has provided a list of addresses identified for the program.

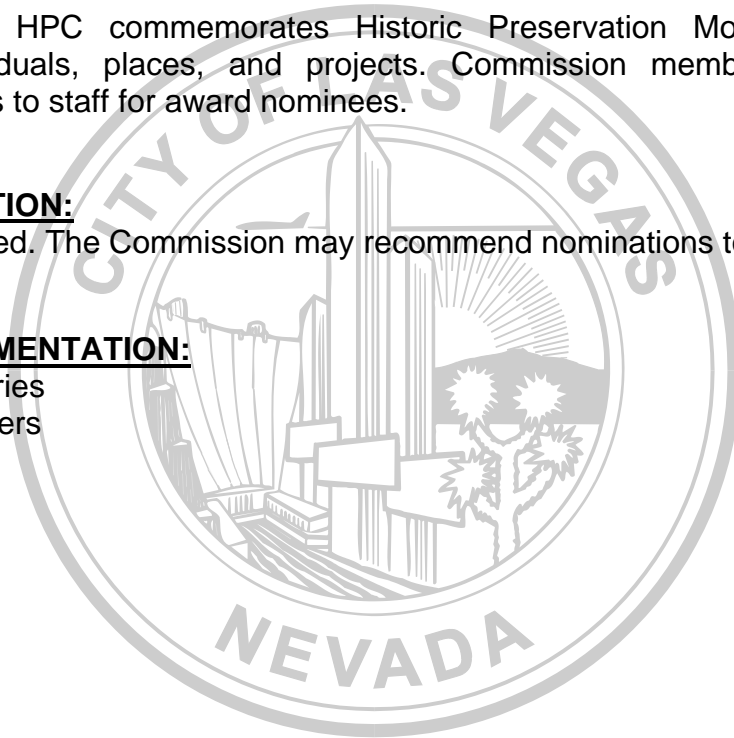

HPC Annual Awards for Excellence in Historic Preservation Categories

HPC approved 3/27/13, (Dorothy Wright name change approved later)

DOROTHY WRIGHT BRICKS AND MORTAR AWARD to include individuals, organizations and agencies that have sponsored a historic rehabilitation, compatible addition and/or energy efficient upgrade project.

PRESERVATION EDUCATION AWARD to include individuals, organizations and agencies that have sponsored an historical interpretation project (such as historical markers), artwork, publications, workshops, curricula and/or research.

ADVOCACY AWARD to include individuals or organizations that have gone above and beyond to save a threatened resource.

CAREER ACHIEVEMENT AWARD to include individuals who have an exemplary track record in the field of historic preservation and/or archaeology.

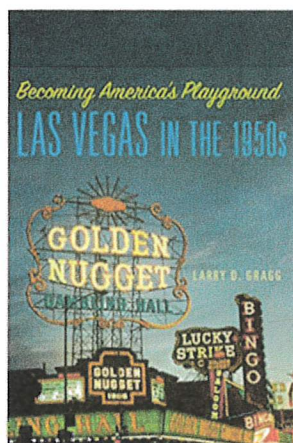
Larry Gragg Career Achievement

Larry is a professor at Missouri University of Science and Technology, where he teaches the History of Las Vegas and American Civilization courses.

He has also been a department chair since 2003 and is an active award-winning writer and scholar.

Coming to Las Vegas in 1992, he has written several books on the city and community and articles on Las Vegas for the Nevada Historical Society Quarter.

Known for his dedication to research and facts, Gragg has a new book, coming out and the end of next month; "Las Vegas in the 1950's"



Dr. Gragg also writes for the Nevada Humanities "Online Nevada Encyclopedia." ONE is a project of [Nevada Humanities](#), helping preserve and making accessible Nevada's rich and unique history and heritage."

Among the articles Dr. Gragg has written about Las Vegas include [Live Wire Fund](#) "Near the end of World War II businessmen in Las Vegas began planning for the post-war economy. Much of the town's prosperity had been built upon the payrolls of the 25,000 civilian and military employees the Las Vegas Chamber of Commerce developed a promotional campaign to make" Downtown Las Vegas, and the four hotels on the Los Angeles highway an appealing tourist town."

Other articles include a survey of the history of Las Vegas from 1905 to 1940 of the challenges Las Vegas faced in becoming a resort town.

Dr. Andy Kirk, Chairman of the History Department at UNLV. Says of Gregg's work "With meticulous research and insight, Larry Gragg shows how Las Vegas and its enterprising citizens transformed Las Vegas into one of the most visited places on Earth.

David Swartz former Director of UNLV's center for gaming research says of Gragg that he takes "a carefully honed intellectual approach" in his writings about Las Vegas.

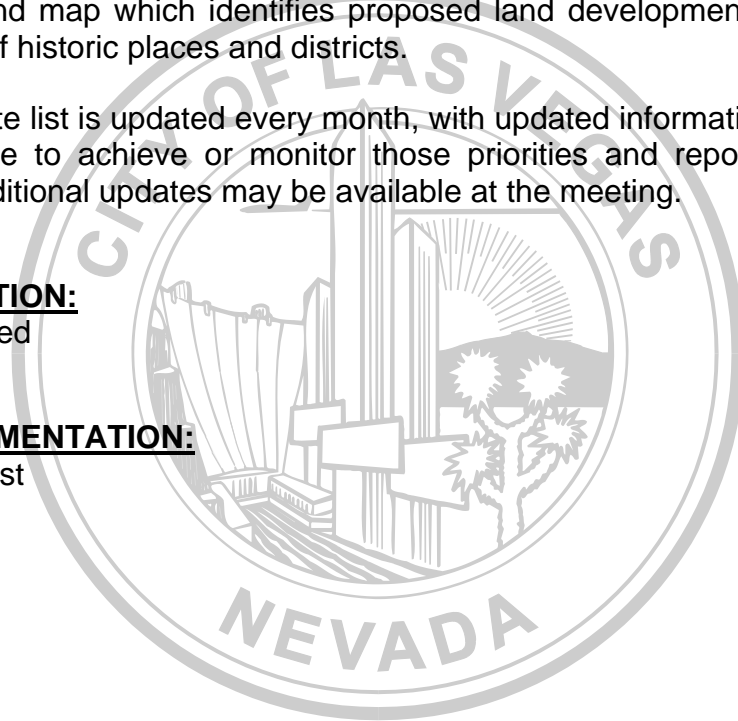
