CHIEF PUBLIC SAFETY SERVICES OFFICER TIM HACKER said Item 27 is for an extension of the agreement in place with Clark County and the Southern Nevada Health District for testing. He noted the City of Las Vegas provides a Marshal for security, and this cost as well as other associated costs are reflected in the agreement. Item 28 is for a new agreement with Clark County and the Southern Nevada Health District for vaccinations for the community. Security has been provided internally by the City, and the Fire Chief has provided a standby medical team in the event someone receiving the vaccine has an adverse reaction. FIRE CHIEF JEFF BUCHANAN, Director of Fire and Rescue, added that he visited the location, which is working well and includes an intense collaboration with the National Guard, Clark County Fire Department, and the City of Las Vegas. His team will continue to provide assistance at the location, and he appreciated the support of the Council. CITY MANAGER JORGE CERVANTES indicated this agreement is effective until the end of the calendar year, and he supported the recommendation.

CITY ATTORNEY BRYAN SCOTT stated that COUNCILMAN ANTHONY requested staff review the City of Las Vegas' animal cruelty ordinances to determine if there was a need for the ordinances to be updated. DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY DAVID BAILEY was assigned to the matter and reviewed the City's ordinances as well as those of the City of Henderson, the City of North Las Vegas, and Clark County.

Through the use of a PowerPoint presentation, a copy of which was submitted and attached as backup, MR. BAILEY reviewed the Las Vegas Municipal Code as it relates to animal cruelty, which is defined as every act of omission or commission whereby unjustifiable physical pain, suffering, or death is caused to any animal. Violations of the municipal code are misdemeanor offenses, are punishable by a fine not exceeding \$1,000, or imprisonment not exceeding six months, or a combination of the two. Most of the following violations apply to any person who owns, possess, has care of, or control of an animal. Some of the violations within the Las Vegas Municipal Code pertaining to animal cruelty include mandatory minimum sentences, which include mandatory jail time, community service, and fines. These specific violations include abandoning an animal without adequate care; poisoning an animal; overworking, torturing, or beating an animal; depriving an animal of food, water, or shelter; or failing to obtain veterinary care when needed; persons convicted of one of these violations may be court ordered to surrender the animal. In addition to the mandatory minimum sentences, persons convicted of abandoning an animal or of not providing the animal with appropriate sustenance may be ordered to pay restitution for the cost, care, and impoundment of the animal to the City of Las Vegas.

MR. BAILEY reviewed a PowerPoint slide regarding the other violations within the municipal code that do not have the mandatory minimum sentences but are still misdemeanors. In addition to what can be prosecuted under the Las Vegas Municipal Code, there are offenses under Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) that may be prosecuted as misdemeanors. If something is defined in NRS as a gross misdemeanor or a felony, then the District Attorney's Office pursues that matter; however, the severity of the charge depends upon the action, which MR. BAILEY reviewed.

MR. BAILEY compared the Las Vegas Municipal Code to neighboring jurisdictions pointing out differences within each. Clark County has more specificity regarding keeping dogs and cats outdoors as well as tethering dogs. The City of Henderson has animal cruelty violations and penalties similar to the City Las Vegas but provides a more specific term for shelters. Tethering within the City of Henderson is similar to what is specified in NRS. The City of North Las Vegas has more specificity regarding tethering of dogs as well as hoarding of animals ordinance, which is particular to the jurisdiction. For such a violation, there is no mandatory penalty but a judge can impose a fine of up to \$500, or six months in jail, or a combination of the two. The court can also order a psychiatric evaluation of the person or prohibit the ownership of animals for up to two years during any time of probation. Additionally, the City of North Las Vegas has a provision that there will be higher fines and mandatory jail if an individual is convicted more than one time.

Lastly, MR. BAILEY shared statistics and factual scenarios regarding animal cruelty cases submitted to the City

Attorney's Office of the City of Las Vegas.

Through the use of a second PowerPoint presentation, a copy of which was submitted and attached as backup, LIEUTENANT JOHN GUILLEN, Department of Public Safety – Animal Control Division, shared the mission of the Department of Public Safety. He explained that Animal Control Officers I and II are non-sworn civilians, do not have the powers of arrest equal to a Nevada Category 1 Police Officer, can issue misdemeanor citations and civil infractions, and receive training in the identification of abuse/neglect of animals. LIEUTENANT GUILLEN reviewed a PowerPoint slide with some of the responsibilities of the Animal Control Division including enforcing pet ordinances and laws, issuing special pet permits, helping to control the animal population via spay and neuter laws and education, ensuring public safety and animal welfare, acting as custodian of the Emergency Mobile Animal Shelter, participating in cruelty investigations, and educating the public on responsible pet ownership. The unit serves all Wards, consists of 13 Animal Control Officers as well as two Animal Control Supervisors, and work seven days a week from 6:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m. Outside of these hours, there is an Animal Control Officer who is on call and can respond to calls that require immediate attention. The Animal Control Division may issue civil citations based on Title 7 ordinances for things such as an unspayed animal, no pet license, running at large, no proof of rabies vaccination, or an abundance of animals. The pet owner is assigned a hearing date at least 30 days from the violation and must go before a City of Las Vegas Hearing Officer. The unit also issues misdemeanor criminal citations in accordance with Title 7 ordinances, and NRS which are issued when prior civil citations have been issued and infractions are still present, recurring, or the severity of the infraction requires it to be at this level as well as for sustenance deprivation, abandonment, or vehicle confinement. Felony violations are utilized when severe animal cruelty occurs and are issued under NRS 574.100. The Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department (Metro) – Animal Cruelty Unit Detectives are contacted and take the lead on these cruelty cases using their authority to arrest and charge for the felonies. Care is ensured for the pets involved in the cases, which are adjudicated through the District Attorney's Office, and Animal Control Officers will testify in felony cases when called upon. Lastly, LIEUTENANT GUILLEN reviewed the top calls for service in 2019 and 2020, which were animals running at large, animal cruelty related such as no shelter/food/water, and deceased animal found on roadways/public property typically struck by a vehicle. He shared the information for the Animal Control Division.

LIEUTENANT GUILLEN informed MAYOR GOODMAN that in 2020, there were 23,798 calls for service of which 1,160 had an alleged cruelty component to it. The vast majority of the complaints were unfounded or did not rise above the misdemeanor level. He noted there is one vehicle per staff member and if the details of the call demand it, more than one Animal Control Officer may respond.

The Mayor wondered about the inclusion of other types of pets within the Las Vegas Municipal Code and asked MR. BAILEY to keep this in mind going forward.

COUNCILWOMAN FIORE commented that she owned a potbelly pig. She asked about the purpose of the Fancier Permit. SERGEANT JIM RODGERS, Animal Control Supervisor, said under the Fancier Permit, an individual could have six dogs or 12 cats. All animals must be spayed and neutered, licensed, and current on shots. A Breeder Permit may also be obtained for breeding.

COUNCILWOMAN SEAMAN wondered if a dog is removed if animal cruelty was suspected. SERGEANT RODGERS replied that it depends upon the circumstances. Typically, the pet owner is given the opportunity to remedy the situation; however, if neglect is suspected, Metro may be called out to respond and the dog removed. The determination of confiscating the dog can be made by the Animal Control Division but is dependent upon the condition of the dog. MR. BAILEY added that the District Attorney's Office reported there were 51 felony cases of animal cruelty within Las Vegas last year.

COUNCILMAN KNUDSEN thanked staff for the presentation and said he conducted a ride along with OFFICER PHILLIP HAWK, Animal Control Officer II, who was informative and kind.

COUNCILMAN ANTHONY thanked staff for the report. He asked the Department of Public Safety to consider if it has the resources needed to conduct thorough investigations to protect the animals and enforce the ordinances of the City. CHIEF LOUIS MOLINA, Director of Public Safety, stated that he is going through a department-wide assessment of operational needs and will follow up with this. He indicated to the Councilman that he will look at best practices of the other jurisdictions where he worked. MR. SCOTT confirmed for COUNCILMAN ANTHONY that the City of Las Vegas is on par with the other jurisdictions as it relates to animal cruelty ordinances and did not believe anything needed to be addressed at the moment.

COUNCILMAN ANTHONY had several things brought to his attention by the public and asked that staff review

mandatory minimum sentencing, banning tethering altogether, and if someone is found guilty of animal cruelty that this person be banned from owning another dog indefinitely. MR. SCOTT confirmed staff would review these suggestions.

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT AND SOCIAL INNOVATION - DISCUSSION

Through a PowerPoint presentation, a copy of which was submitted and attached as backup, DR. TAMMY MALICH, Director of Youth Development and Social Innovation, announced this was the 21st year for the Youth Neighborhood Association Partnership Program (YNAPP). To date, the program has funded 622 projects totaling \$567,728 in investments from the City of Las Vegas; the astounding match of this amount is over \$5.5 million. Several photos of the 2019-2020 recipients and their projects were shown; even through the COVID-19 pandemic, these recipients were still able to complete their projects on time with kindness and compassion.

This year there was a humble number of applications submitted to the YNAPP Grant Review Board, which were awarded based upon pre-established criteria including creativity, uniqueness, passion, community impact, and grant match. Lastly, MS. MALICH thanked the Mayor and Council as well City of Las Vegas staff for their assistance. She was present with SERENA CERVACIO, Chair, and NIGEL MURRAY, Vice Chair of the YNAPP Grant Review Board, who gave a brief background about themselves and expressed their gratitude towards the Mayor and Council for the opportunity to serve on the Board. MS. CERVACIO and MR. MURRAY recognized this year's YNAPP Grant Review Board members and reviewed the recommendations for the 27 projects in the amount of \$26,949.37. Together, these projects will provide the city with a match of over \$82,427 in volunteer hours, in-kind donations, and/or financial contributions. Nineteen of the projects focus on community services, one project focuses on community improvement, and seven projects support community education; each was recognized by group and project name as well as the recommended amount to award.

MAYOR GOODMAN commented on the importance of the participation from the Board as well as the community in giving back through volunteer hours.

Subsequent to the motion, COUNCILWOMAN FIORE stated that CHANCE BONAVENTURA, Special Assistant to Council, would be reaching out to MS. CERVACIO and MR. MURRAY as she had boxes of toys to donate. COUNCILWOMAN DIAZ applauded those who have stepped up to help the community as it matters now more than ever.

At the request of MAYOR GOODMAN, MS. CERVACIO and MR. MURRAY shared their future plans. DR. MALICH pointed out that MR. MURRAY is still operating his own non-profit, which COUNCILMAN CREAR shared the name of, which is Clothes for Kids LV, and congratulated MR. MURRAY for continuing his endeavors.
