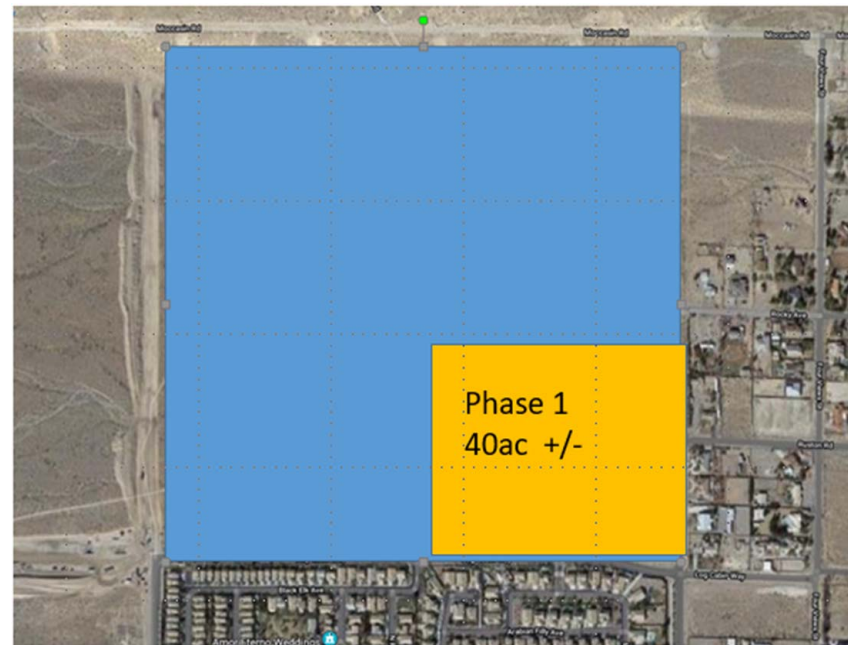

Northwest Regional Park – Ward 6 El Capitan Way and Log Cabin Way

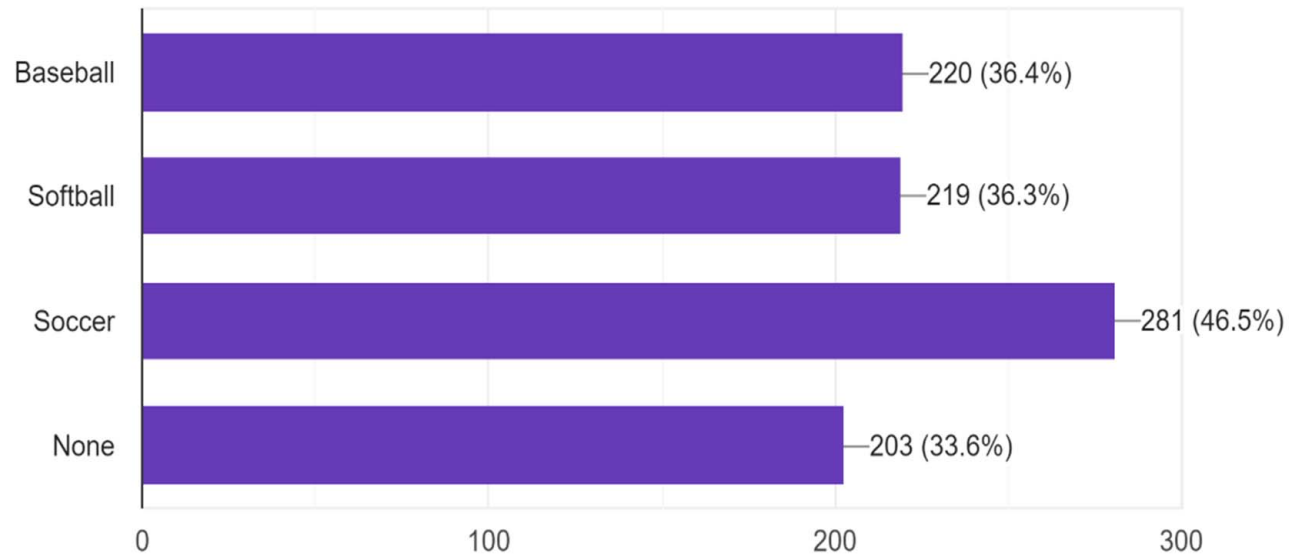

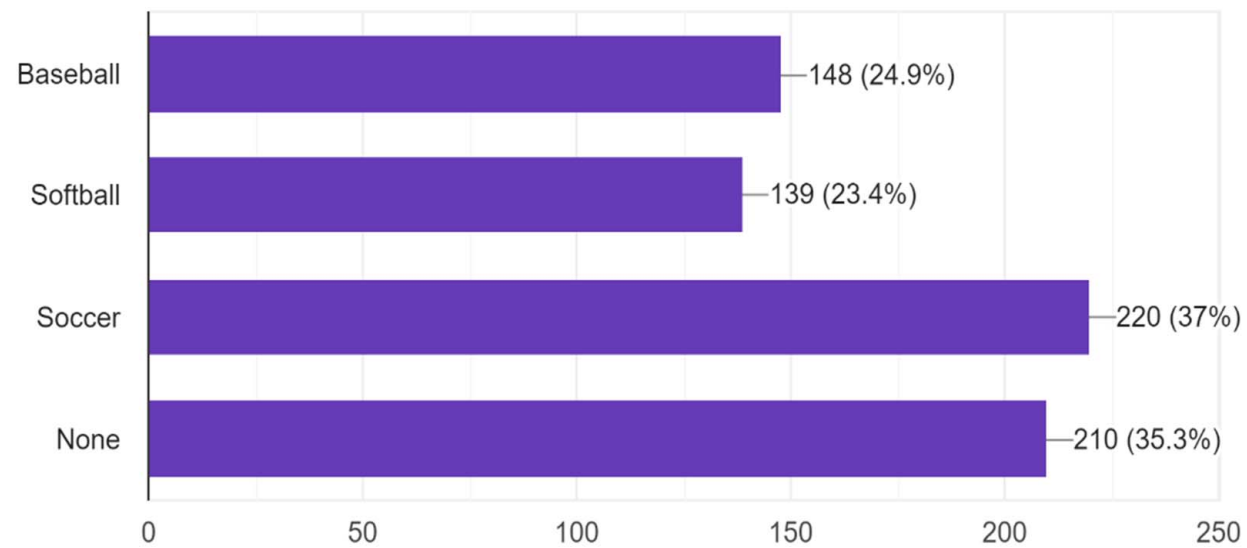
What kinds of sports fields would you like to see? (check all that apply)

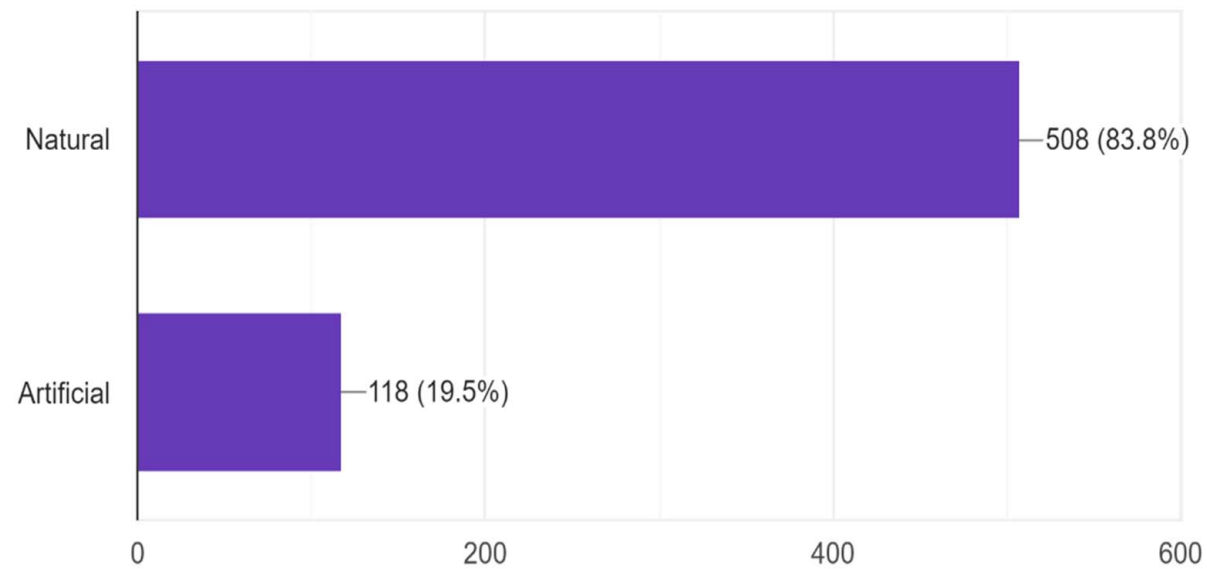
Which sport fields do you most prefer?

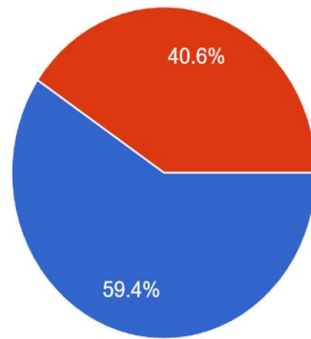
Which type of turf do you prefer?

Are you interested in a dog park?

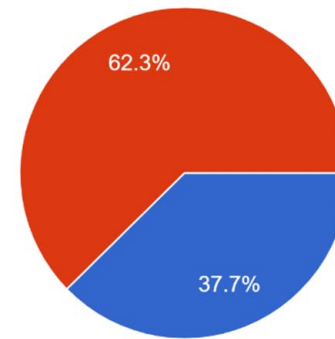

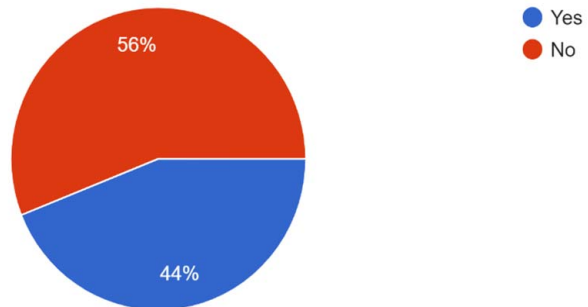

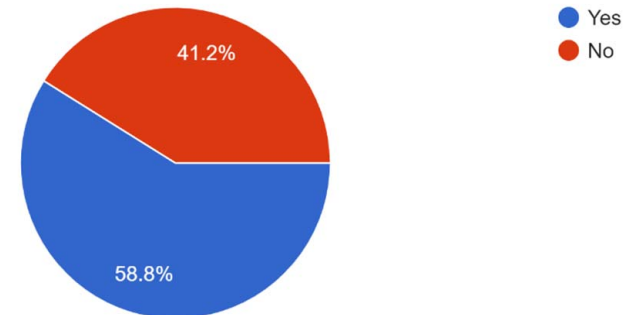

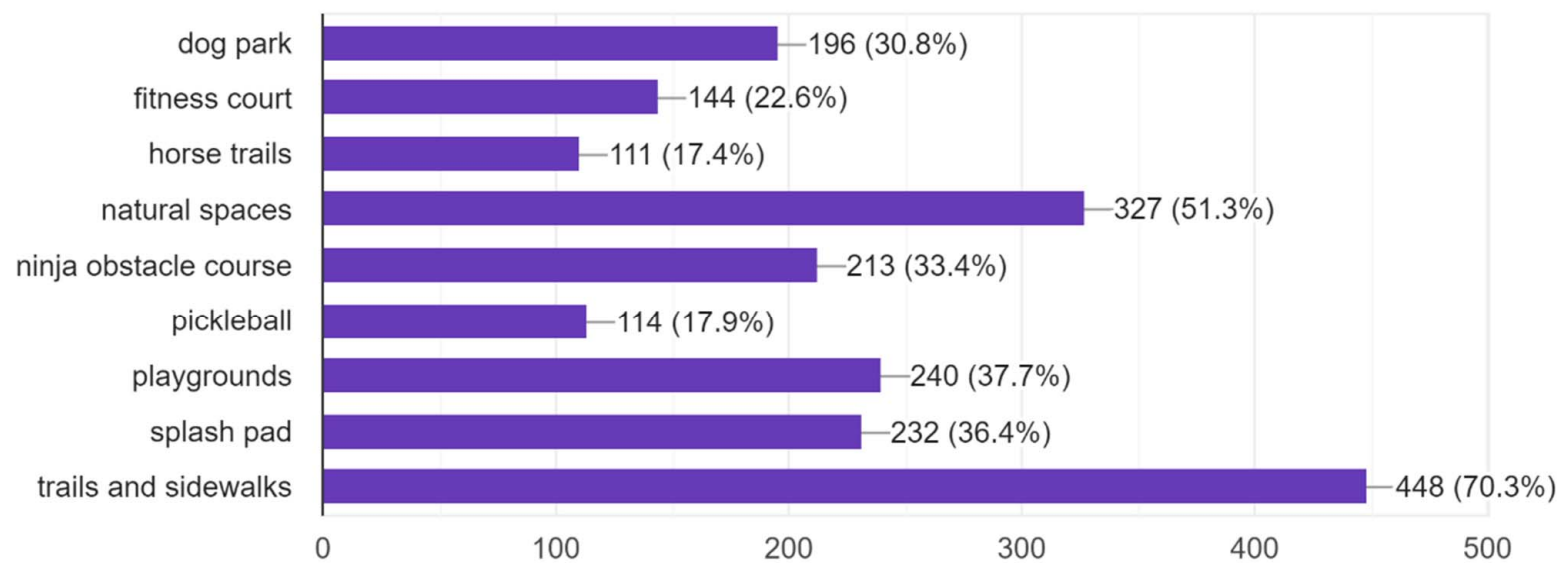


Would you be interested in a ninja warrior obstacle course?

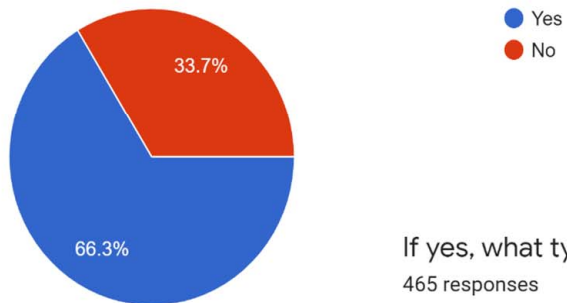
Select your top two to three park amenities:

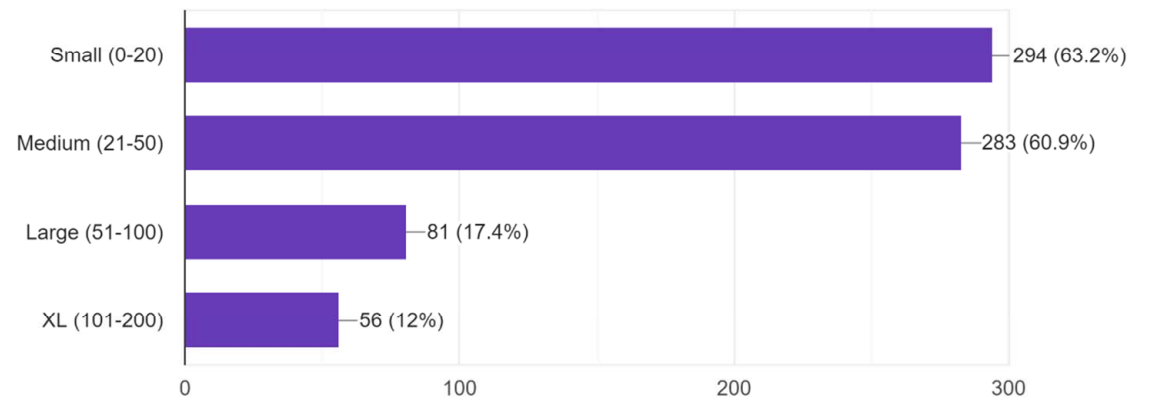
Are you interested in having reservable picnic areas?

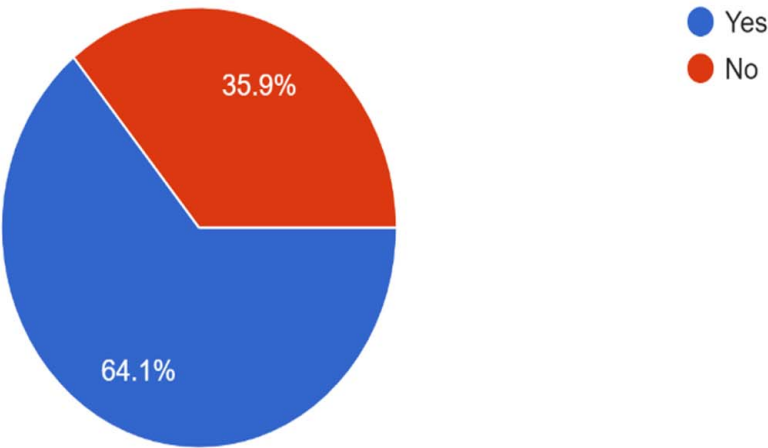
If yes, what types of reservable picnic areas are you interested in? (check all that apply)
