- 03/17/22 – Following the final welding inspection it was determined that the sculpture would require additional work. The sculpture was transported to Blaque Metal Works for completion.
- 02/17/22 – Final inspection scheduled for 2/17/2022.
- 01/20/22 – The fabrication is moving forward with an updated completion date of on or before February 23, 2022.

- 08/18/22 - The request for qualifications posted on June 28, 2022 and closed on August 8, 2022. The city received 106 submissions to review and evaluate. The evaluation panel will select three semi-finalists to create and present proposals in the fourth quarter of 2022.
- 06/16/22 - The project scope and purchase requisition have been provided to Purchasing & Contracts for incorporation into the request for qualifications solicitation. The project team has identified four (4) locations for potential works of art. The final determination on location is to be determined.

► **CONSERVATION AND MAINTENANCE (Arts Commission)**

Location: *Throughout CLV Collection*

Status: *Ongoing*

Budget Allocation: *\$60,000 (FY22, Percent for Arts)*

Current Expenditures: *\$53,132.92 (FY22); \$30,510.00 (FY23)*

- 08/18/22 – Staff facilitated the successful relocation and installation of the *Nephele* sculpture by Cyd Bown, which is now permanently sited at the East Las Vegas Community Center (\$16,870.00).
 - Staff have sourced scaffolding for the East Las Vegas Community Center Mural Project (\$13,640.00).
 - Staff continue efforts to source information and address the recent damages to the *Liberty Bell* at the Historic Fifth Street School, Centennial Plaza.
 - Staff completed and submitted the annual fixed asset inventory of artworks to the Finance Department on June 30, 2022.
 - Staff have relocated the *Ancestral Gateway Stepping Stones* to an alternate hallway within the Doolittle Complex, due to space availability and access concerns.

-Staff report the purchase of artwork hanging materials, miscellaneous maintenance items and artwork labels in total for Fiscal Year 2022 (\$723.66).

- 06/16/22 – Staff removed graffiti from the NV Energy-owned AMP Cabinet near Centennial Parkway and 215, by artist Valentin Yordanov.
 - Staff have been notified that the *Radial Symmetry* sculpture by Luis Varela Rico has been damaged and the artist has been contacted to provide a quote for repair.
 - Staff continue to work towards the completion of the annual fixed asset inventory of artworks in the collection, which is due by June 30, 2022.
 - Staff are working to address recent damages to the *Liberty Bell* at the Historic Fifth Street School, Centennial Plaza.
 - Staff have repaired and repainted portions of the pedestal for *Emergent* by Javier Sanchez and Yasmina Chavez.
 - Engineering services have been obtained and completed for the *Nephele* sculpture by Cyd Bown, allowing for a horizontal orientation display at the East Las Vegas Community Center.
 - Staff are investigating upgrades to the existing collection management software in order to allow for more accessible features across platforms.
- 05/19/22 – Staff continue to work towards the completion of the annual fixed asset inventory of artworks in the collection, which is due in June 2022.
 - Staff have re-installed an untitled Frank Morrison print at the Doolittle Senior Center.
 - Staff removed graffiti from the AMP Cabinet at the corner of Rancho and Charleston, by artist Andrea Pavles.
 - Level the Playing Field* by Gig Depio will be installed by JW Caldwell at the Municipal Courthouse (\$315.00).
- 04/21/22 – Staff have applied the anti-graffiti and protective coating to the new AMP Downtown cabinet by Jerry Misko, which is located near the Plaza Hotel on Main Street.
 - Staff continue to work towards the completion of the annual fixed asset inventory of artworks in the collection, which is due in June 2022.
 - Staff have conducted a condition report for the painted concrete artwork at Lubertha Johnson Park, which is in need of extensive conservation and restoration.
 - Staff have made great progress in the maintenance and conservation of the *Snowball in Vegas* sculpture by Jesse Carson Smigel, which has a failing anti-graffiti protective coating most noticeable on the western-facing side of the sculpture.
 - Staff are assessing next steps for the Terrazo Tables by Christoff Koon, which have sustained fire and environmental damage.
 - Staff have removed multiple markings and tags from the *Bear With Me* AMP cabinet by Shan Michael Evans.
- 03/17/22 – Staff have consulted with Adolfo Gonzalez and requested a quote from the original fabricator for repairs to the lighting and surfaces of the *Southern Nevada Law Enforcement Memorial*.
 - Staff have scheduled regular twice-monthly cleanings of the recently-installed artworks and plaques at the Historic Westside Legacy Park.
 - The lighting and sankofa birds for the *Queen of the Arts* sculpture by Gus & Lina Ocamposilva has been replaced.
 - Staff are working to complete the annual fixed asset inventory of artworks in the collection, which is due in June 2022.

- Staff continue to petition for funding to support the needed maintenance and conservation efforts for *Paintbrush Gateway* by Dennis Oppenheim.
- Two artistic bike racks by artist Randy Mendre have been removed from a site near Casino Center and Charleston Boulevard, due to the need to install a Las Vegas Valley Water District backflow cabinet. The artworks have been temporarily relocated to an offsite location and staff will work to identify a suitable location for re-installation.
- Staff continue efforts to coordinate maintenance and conservation of the *Snowball in Vegas* sculpture by Jesse Carson Smigel, which has a failing anti-graffiti protective coating most noticeable on the western-facing side of the sculpture.
- Engineering services are being secured for the *Nephele* sculpture by Cyd Bown, in order to reconfigure the artwork for horizontal display and suspension (\$4,500.00)
- A quote for services to apply the anti-graffiti and protective coating to the *A Rose in the Desert* mural by Argu has been received (\$2,460.00 est.)
- 02/17/22 – Staff have been notified of concerns regarding the condition of the *Southern Nevada Law Enforcement Memorial* by Adolfo Gonzalez. A site visit and subsequent report noted deterioration of the protective coating, as well as discrepancies in the stones along the ledge of the base. Staff will work to address accordingly.
 - The lighting and sankofa birds for the *Queen of the Arts* sculpture by Gus & Lina Ocamposilva will be replaced with new reinforced materials (\$3,997.00).
 - Staff removed graffiti from the *Statue of Former President Barack Obama* by Hanlon Sculpture studios.
 - Staff have removed graffiti from *Ansan Sister City Park Sculpture* located in Ansan Sister City Park and are assessing the need for a bronze cleaning and waxing.
 - Staff met with Wayne Littlejohn to discuss maintenance needs and best practices for the *Atomic Tumbleweed* sculpture.
 - Primer (\$107.92) and labels (\$400.00) have been purchased for various projects.
- 01/20/22 – Staff continue to work with Jesse Carson Smigel to address the graffiti and surface markings on the *Snowball in Vegas* sculpture.
 - The sprinkler assessment for the *Nephele* sculpture by Cyd Bown has determined the proposed placement of the artworks at the East Las Vegas Community Center will not impact the sprinkler system. This report will be issued to the Fire Department for final review and possible approval.
 - The *Bunker Park Decorative Disposal Containers* created in 1998 by Lori Fratianno have been deaccessioned to the safety hazards posed by the deterioration of the materials.
 - A quote has been received to reinforce and replace damaged portions and design reinforced lighting at the *Queen of the Arts* sculpture by Gus & Lina Ocamposilva.
 - The lighting for *Radial Symmetry* by Luis Varela Rico has been reconnected and restored.
 - A test has been conducted to determine the best chemical to remove the failing anti-graffiti coating on the *Monument to the Simulacrum* sculpture by Stephen Hendee. Staff intend to begin the process of removing and repairing the failing coating.
 - Staff continue to maintain the concrete pedestals located along Main Street, in preparation for the installation of the *Emergent* sculpture by Yasmina Chavez and Javier Sanchez and multiple *Contemporary Public Art Projects*.

- 12/16/21 – Staff continue to work with Jesse Carson Smigel to address the graffiti and surface markings on the *Snowball in Vegas* sculpture.
 - Staff attended a walkthrough of the East Las Vegas Community Center on 12/06/21 in order to assist in the completion of a fire sprinkler assessment being conducted by TERPconsulting for the *Nephele* sculpture by Cyd Bown.
 - Staff have infilled additional white gravel in the *Atomic Passage* benches by Atomic Industries, in order to alleviate ongoing debris issues in the planters (\$98.43).
 - Staff have been advised of the need to remove and deaccession the *Bunker Park Decorative Disposal Containers* created in 1998 by Lori Fratianno due to the deterioration of the materials.
 - Staff are seeking services to repair damaged portions and replace lighting at the *Queen of the Arts* sculpture by Gus & Lina Ocamposilva.
 - Staff have been notified that the lighting for *Radial Symmetry* by Luis Varela Rico is currently not operational; efforts are in progress to remedy the issue.
- 11/18/21 – Staff continue to work with Jesse Carson Smigel to address the graffiti and surface markings on the *Snowball in Vegas* sculpture.
 - Staff have removed graffiti from the AMP cabinet by Caitlyn Saville.
 - The AMP cabinet by Juliana Cabral for the Sun City Summerlin 2019 project has been removed and replaced, due to issues with the interior components.
 - The *Reflections of Energy* sculpture by Tony Milici is undergoing a condition assessment to determine next best steps.
 - The collection of Historic Photographs of Mayors, Councilmembers & Commissioners has been installed at City Hall, in front of the City Council Chambers.
 - Staff have submitted a fiscal year 2023 Capital Improvements Project funding request for the maintenance and repair of the *Paintbrush Gateway* sculptures by Dennis Oppenheim.
 - A fire sprinkler assessment is being conducted for the *Nephele* sculpture by Cyd Bown, in order to confirm the feasibility of placing the artwork at the East Las Vegas Community Center (\$1,500.00).
- 10/21/21 – Staff have removed graffiti and surface markings from *Snowball in Vegas* by Jesse Carson Smigel.
 - Staff have removed debris and graffiti from the *Atomic Passage* benches by Atomic Industries.
 - Staff have removed graffiti and debris from the AMP cabinets by Maureen Halligan.
 - Staff have removed debris from the AMP *Bear with Me* cabinet by Shan Michael Evans.
 - Staff have removed graffiti from the *Firefighter Memorial* by John Banks.
 - Staff continues work to repair graffiti removal initiatives for the plaque for the *Film Stars of Yesterday* sculpture by Stephen Liguori.
 - Staff are conducting periodic surface cleaning in preparation for the application of a new protective coating on the *Monument to the Simulacrum* sculpture by Stephen Hendee.
 - Staff developing handbook for graffiti removal and general maintenance for artworks in the collection.
