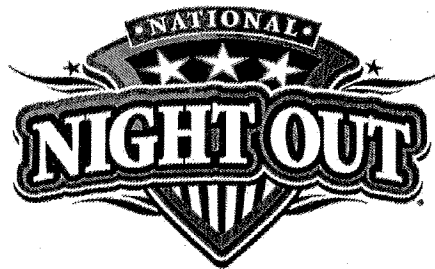
1. What is National Night Out?

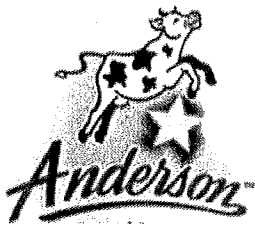

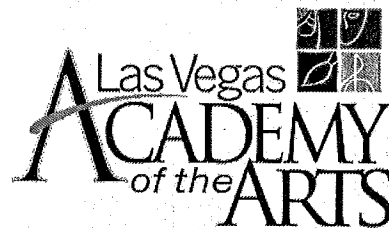

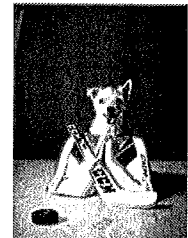
