"Ward 5 Works."

Seniors can develop lactose intolerance and manage it with simple pills. Knowing how much lactose is in a product is challenging, though, and mismanagement can result in loss of work, embarrassment, and hazardous waste. I'm investigating Alisa Fleming's book, *Go Dairy Free*, but I am more interested in a simple guide to lactose amount in various foods. I'll be taking this up with my personal physician.

Medical blood work can be covered for wellness screening, but follow-up costs (\$70 +/-) can be out of pocket unless your employer covers a part of your deductible. In the past, my company has covered the first \$1500 of their \$3000 deductible plan.

Speaking of work, many companies have experienced a reduction in force because of the pandemic. Some have been reduced from full time to on-call status. This has made them ineligible for paid time off (PTO). Some companies allow for reimbursement for community volunteering at the rate of four hours per year PTO.

Full vaccination will also be paid with four hours of PTO within 60 days of last vaccination. Special hours in Human Resources are often set up to accommodate verification, but somehow they were closed when I went with my vaccination card.

The Clark County Regional Flood Control District has a Storm Water Quality Management Committee (SQMC) of which the City of Las Vegas is a member. At 11:35 PM, on Monday, May 3rd, TV station KLAS (008-00) aired a 30 second ad (see attached).

Yesterday, the City of Las Vegas began spraying the crack between the sidewalk and the curb and gutter along west Washington Avenue on both sides in front of Lorenzi Park. Despite repeated requests for the specific herbicide in use over the past five years, the details are unknown. Most herbicides do not recommend spraying in areas which drain to aquatic life.
