DISCUSSION FOR POSSIBLE ACTION TO CHANGE THE SPEED LIMIT ON HUALAPAI WAY BETWEEN ANASAZI DRIVE AND NORTH TOWN CENTER DRIVE - Ward 2 (Seaman)

SITUATION

A resident contacted the City Traffic Engineering Division to inquire about the different speed limits on Hualapai Way. When driving eastbound on Far Hills Avenue between Sagebury Drive and Anasazi Drive the speed limit is posted at 35 mph. When drivers continue southeast and cross Anasazi Drive, Far Hills Drive becomes Hualapai Way and the speed limit increases to 45 mph until you approach the roundabout which has an advisory speed of 15 mph.

This section of Hualapai Way is surrounded by single family homes and serves as a primary collector in and out of the residential neighborhood with 9,000 vpd. It is lined with trees, has wide sidewalks, and frequented by pedestrian and bicyclists daily. In addition, it is adjacent to Crossing Park and the Summerlin Hospital and Medical Office.

Traffic Engineering examined the most recent 3-year crash history and performed a USLimits2 Study to determine the most appropriate speed limit for this segment of the road. The USLimits2 analysis recommended a posted speed limit of 35 mph.

A workorder was submitted to City Maintenance to have the 45 mph signs on Hualapai Way removed and replaced with 35 mph signs, between Anasazi Drive and Town Center Drive. These signs were installed the beginning of October.

The City Traffic Engineer has authority to implement any traffic regulation for up to 90 days. However, permanent changes to the posted speed limit schedule must be heard at a public hearing at the Traffic and Parking Commission Meeting then placed on the City Council agenda for final decision.

RECOMMENDATION

The Transportation Engineering Division recommends permanently changing the posted speed limit from 45 to 35 mph, on Hualapai Way, between Anasazi Drive and North Town Center Drive, based on the USLIMITS2 evaluation study, road geometrics and adjacent land uses.
