3:45 p.m. – Valley High Jobs for Nevada's Graduates (J4NG) Program – "YAY" Youth Assisting Youth

The project is all about helping out homeless youth by providing them with blankets along with other items for the winter season. The project was selected by a committee vote, and everyone felt the most productive community choice was assisting homeless youth. Neighborhood residents will be involved by helping us by donating items that are needed. As well as, helping out by letting the community know about our project.

3:45 p.m. – VVAA – Homeless Care Packages

This project will be putting care packages together for the homeless in our community. These packages will consist of personal hygiene supplies, hand sanitizer, a mask, socks, snacks and a blanket. This project was selected because of the number of homeless people we have in our community along with concerns about the COVID pandemic and changing weather. This is one way we can assist someone who is less fortunate to be safer and warmer during cool nights. This project will allow youth to show concern for others and not always think about themselves.

3:45 p.m. – Warriors of Light Family Inc. – Warriors Of Light

Our project, Warriors Of Light, is a youth oriented program, designed to provide members of the community the tools to empower themselves and others around them, through education and boxing. We selected this project to take on with our advisor, as we believe that the youth in the Las Vegas community deserves a place where they can come and learn, socialize, train, and overall be empowered.

4:15 p.m. – Eagle project - Berto's Bags

The project is made so that mothers that have kids in the NICU get care packages to help them through their struggles as a parent. The reason why I want to do this project is because I had a brother in the NICU and he is no longer with us. As a family we struggled and it was really hard for us this inspired me to help other families they may or are going through the same thing we did. They would help us by putting the packages together so that we may be able to distribute it to the families in the NICU.

4:15 p.m. – Goods for Girls - Goods for Girls

Goods for Girls is on a mission to make sure homeless and impoverished women have access to feminine care supplies. I, Emily Hayes, learned about the crisis homeless women face one sleepless night while surfing the depths of YouTube. I came across a video/documentary on how homeless women take care of a natural bodily process, menstruation. I was astonished by the extremes these women had to go to and how I had never thought of this issue before. Years later while writing my personal essay for college applications, I was asked to write about a problem that I would like to solve. I decided to write about the lack of feminine care supplies for homeless women. After hours of research, I decided the best way to bring awareness, and be a helping hand in solving this problem, was to donate feminine care products to organizations such as Project 150. Project 150 is a local Las Vegas non-profit that serves homeless and impoverished high school students. With this grant money, I will be able to buy feminine care products and donate them to an organization, like Project 150, that will have a widespread distribution of these products. With increased access to feminine care products, homeless women will have one less thing to worry about during these challenging times.

4:45 p.m. – Key Club - Key Club Packages for the Homeless

The project is individual boxes, something like a kit. It has many essentials such as masks, hand sanitizers, and food.

4:45 p.m. – Leaders In Training - Total Tutoring

Total tutoring would offer a wide range of help for middle school students who need help with anything associated with school. We would offer math, reading, writing, science, and technology help. Students can come into the building at Leaders in Training and have us help them with anything they are having a difficult time on. This project was initiated through this program we are all in called Leaders In Training, in where we had to choose a project we wanted to do. However, this came to mind through a conversation one of our group members, Rayven, had with someone. In this conversation the idea came to mind when the other person went to go get help from his mom with his homework. I realized that I never had that growing up, I was never able to go get help from my parents because my parents didn't grow up learning the things I was learning. My parents didn't grow up in America, so they some of the things I was learning was different from what they learned nor did they understand some my work because they didn't really understand English. This was hard growing up because I couldn't really rely on them for help when it came to school, I had to rely on myself or the internet sometimes. In which the idea came to mind of wanting the project to be one where we are able to reach out to students and families and

offer them a free tutoring service. So I reached out to some of my friends from leaders in training to tell them about the idea, which was the start of all of this.

4:45 p.m. – Learners and Lawyers - Learners and Lawyers

A group of High school aged students who have an interest in Law will have the opportunity to shadow Nobles & Yanez Lawyers. These students will be able to see what it takes to become a Lawyer and will get to see the courts in action.

5:45 p.m. – Mahay Medical Group - Doctor For A Day

This project is a community based project where students learn about different doctors. This project was selected by thinking about students being able to visualize what being a doctor is like. The neighborhood residents will be involved by being a part of the presentation and involved in the activities that are going to happen.

5:45 p.m. – STARS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION - FAMILY FUN HEALTH FAIR

The Family Fun Health Fair was created by our youth leaders that have been worried about their families' health during this COVID-19 season. We wanted to do something to help families have a day with NO STRESS ABOUT COVID-19. We want to involve the Community, Business Partners, and Healthcare Workers to come together and have a day of health to be sure that they know how to stay safe and free from COVID-19.

5:45 p.m. – The Traveling Toddler International - The Blessing Project

"The Blessing Project" is to say "Thank You" to our community workers by packing bags filled with M&M's, Goldfish, hand sanitizer, soup (cup of noodles), pens and pencils, masks and tissue. We wanted to give back to our favorite community helpers. On TV we saw so many people getting thanked for working hard during the pandemic but not our friends who we love so much. Who are our friends? The sanitation workers and public bus drivers who come in their big trucks and buses to our neighborhoods. They work really hard and we never see anyone thanking them on TV or anything. The neighborhood residents will be involved by hand-making "Thank you" cards, volunteer time and helping to make bags.

6:15 p.m. – Kellen Cares - Smile Savers

Nutrition and oral hygiene educational sessions will be presented to children in the 89106 zip code. Demonstrations on how to properly brush and floss will also be done. After the educational component, we will be distributing the oral hygiene kits to the children. Studies show that children in underserved economic areas have a higher rate of cavities and gum disease. Dental pain is one of the main causes of school absences and inability to focus at school. Also the 89106 zip code has one of the lowest numbers of dental offices when compared to other zip codes in Las Vegas. The neighborhood residents will be invited to the Smile Saver events.

6:15 p.m. – Pajama Party - Pajama Party

We will be collecting and purchasing new pajama sets for children in the foster care system. We selected this project after speaking with several families with foster children on what they felt the biggest need was for the children. Almost all of the families talked about how the children arrived with a mix match of belongings and more often than not were used to wearing their clothes to bed. We also spoke with several agencies that provide placement for foster children and other community organizations and the need for pajamas was echoed for so many different reasons. Adapting to unfamiliar environments pose unique problems to foster children and families. One of the problems is trouble with sleep. More than 50% of children in foster care have some type of sleep problem. Pajama Party supports a comforting bedtime routine to help children achieve their best. Foster children often go to sleep uncertain of what tomorrow will bring, compromising their health, school performance and emotional well-being. A comforting bedtime routine helps children get the sleep they need. Sleep is essential as proper food & exercise to help children grow. We have selected a team of youth to help purchase, sort/label, and distribute the pajamas to children in foster care. The neighborhood residents have been given the opportunity to select which of the 3 teams they want to be a part of and each team is paired with an adult volunteer.

6:15 p.m. – We Refuse to Forget Project - We Refuse to Forget Project

The We Refuse to Forget Project is a way to give homeless or runaway teens underwear and bras, so they can keep their hygiene while they are in a bad situation. We selected this project because my family works a lot with the community and we have seen the situations that people can be in. This project should give people hope that people do still care about them. Neighborhood residents can help us give away these items.

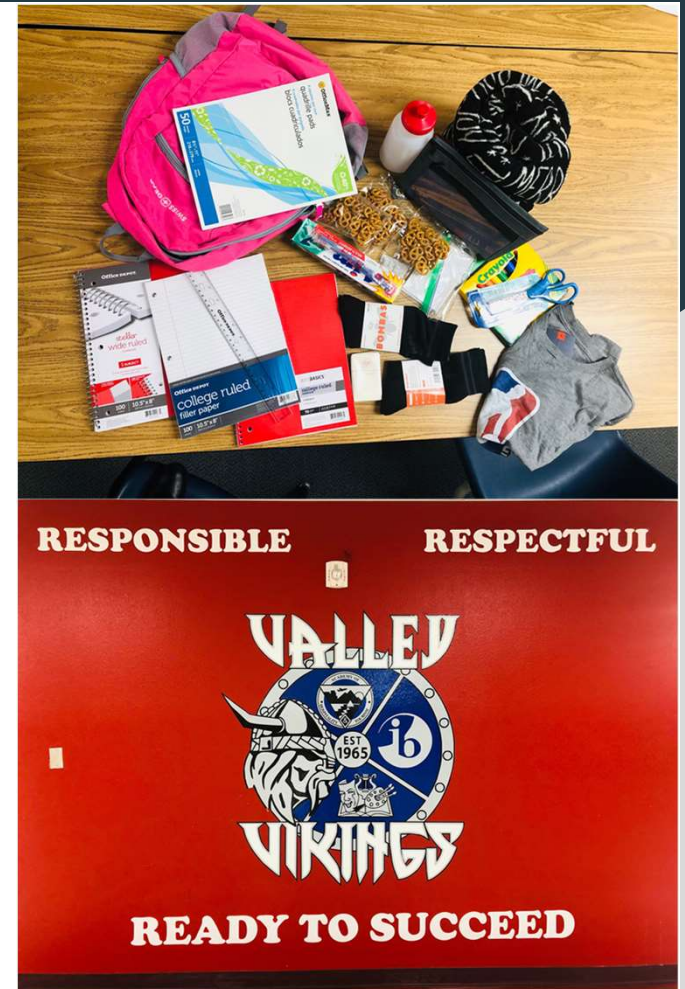

This year we are hoping to be able to complete our project while also practicing Covid-19 safety regulations.

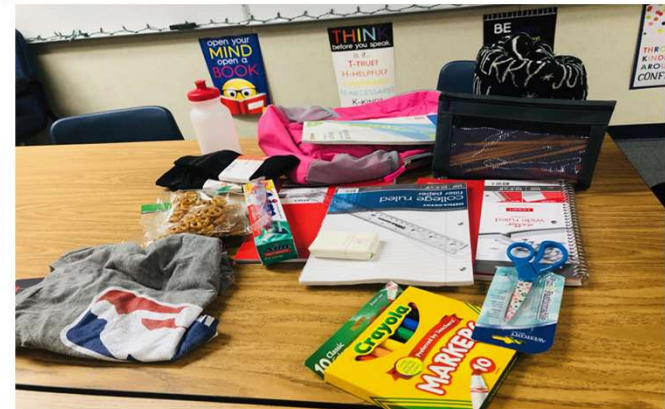
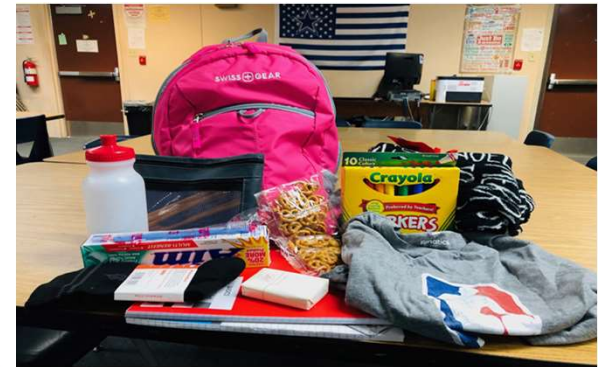


Community Needs

- A Blanket



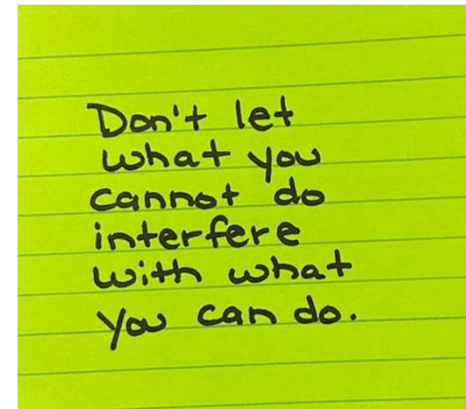
Procedure

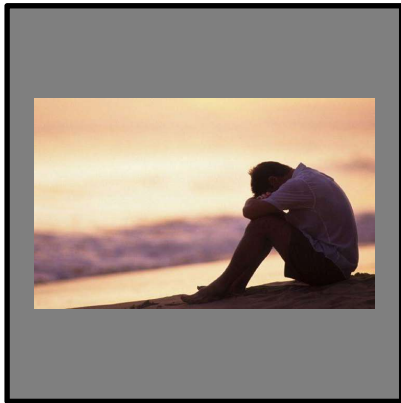

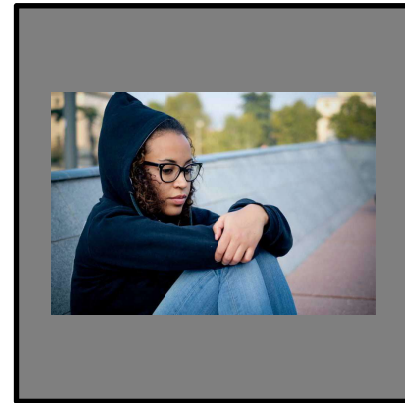
Statistics

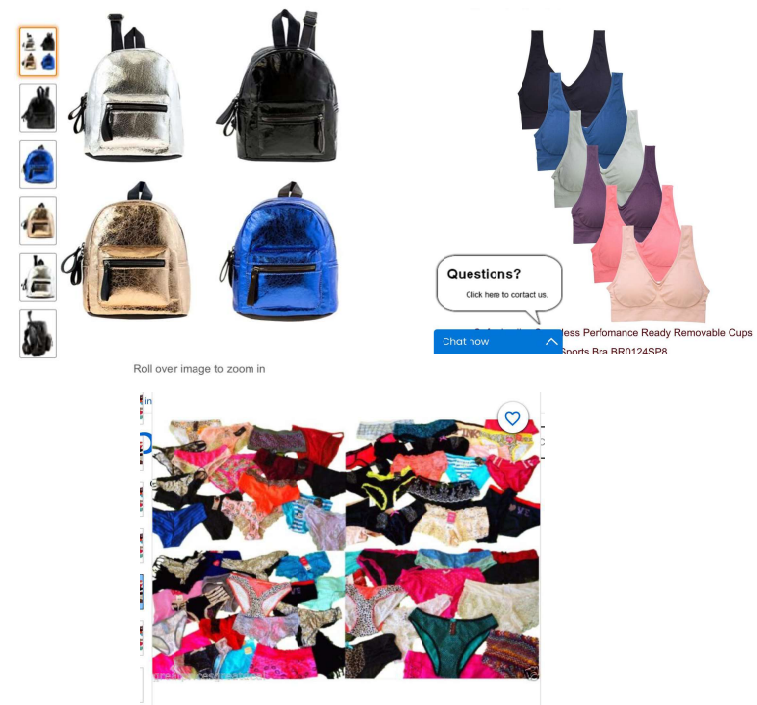
Just One Project

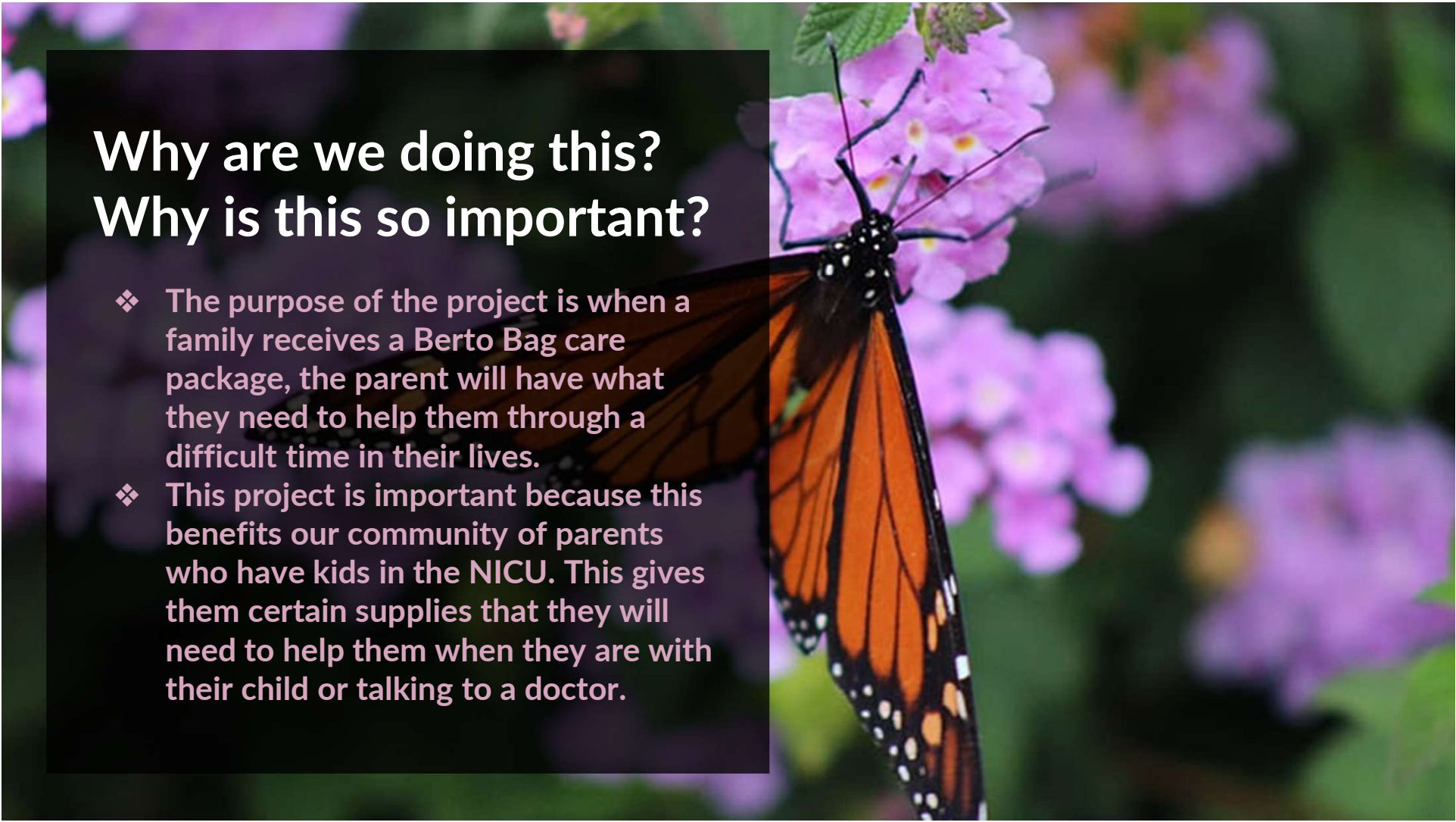


First Project Yet!

→ About It

The Ronald McDonald house in Las Vegas provides temporary housing for families who travel in our city to receive critical medical treatment for their children.



Why are we doing this? Why is this so important?

- ❖ The purpose of the project is when a family receives a Berto Bag care package, the parent will have what they need to help them through a difficult time in their lives.
- ❖ This project is important because this benefits our community of parents who have kids in the NICU. This gives them certain supplies that they will need to help them when they are with their child or talking to a doctor.

For our reflection activity we are going back to the Ronald McDonald house to get both positive and negative feedback on the project. This is so we can improve it and hopefully continue it onto other organizations.



Lucia Eichelberger:

“The reason that we have decided to do this project is because we wanted to do something in memory of a little boy named Robert Desmond Eichelberger. He is actually my brother and Christopher’s cousin. He was a **NICU** (Newborn Intensive Care Unit) baby, who sadly did not survive. We both wanted to do this so that mothers that have kids in the **NICU** are able to know that they aren't alone, and that they can do this, and there is someone out there thinking of them.”

Christopher Zirpoli:

“We are doing this because not only is this project the first one we’ve ever done, but also because we want to help other families overcome the challenges they face when their child is in the **NICU**, especially when we lost someone from our family. This is more important because of the current COVID-19 pandemic we’re facing, and the pandemic makes it difficult for someone to ever see their loved one in the hospital.”

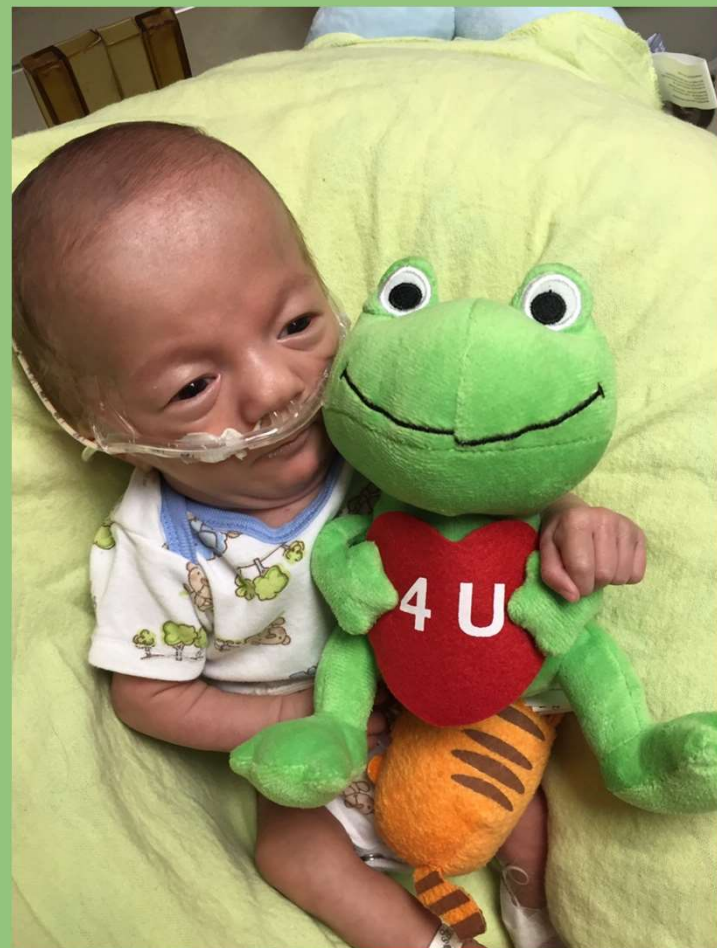
