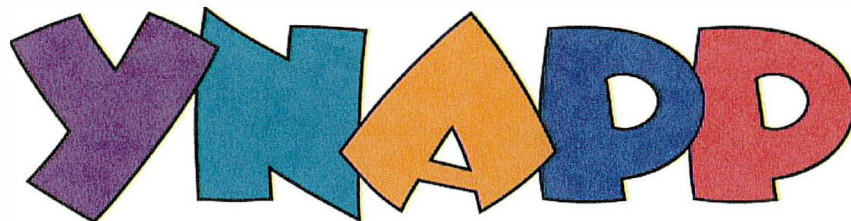

3:40 p.m. – Robert Lunt Elementary: Team Lions – Community Wall Musical Garden Beautification Project

We will beautify a large wall with fresh paint and a wall length mural that celebrates the history of Robert Lunt Elementary and our awesome students, faculty members, and programs. In addition to the wall/mural beautification project, we will create a "musical garden" embedded along our running path. We will mount outdoor instruments that will be fastened to the wall in select areas for an added auditory experience for students and community participants to enjoy when participating in the Running Club, the Wellness Club Program, etc.

3:40 p.m. – Wild 'N Out Wednesday's Advisory Council – Safe Space Stage: A Continuanance for Our Mental Marathon

Safe Space Stage: A continuance for our Mental Marathon is a 6-hour experience that creates a platform for our community to engage in honest and healthy dialogue about the mental health crisis effecting youth and young adults in our community. Safe Space Stage will resemble a conference format, with youthful insight and an interactive twist. We will have multiple breakout sessions facilitated by our community partners. This event will provide our community with the opportunity to engage in self-exploration, community enrichment, and discover tangible solutions to address this crisis that is destroying our peers.

3:40 p.m. – Motivation Music Education Organization – Motivation Music Education Organization

This project was selected due to our passion of music and the joy of working with kids. Residents are always involved because they bring their children to support the events. This program teaches the kids work ethic, people skills and ways to express music in so many different ways.

4:00 p.m. – Caring Crayons – Caring Crayons

I would like to help special education teachers by giving them egg shaped crayons for their classrooms. My mom is a special education teacher. She needs school supplies just like other teachers but, she needs special supplies like egg shaped crayons. These crayons are easier for little kids with special needs to use. People don't know that my mom and other teachers need the supplies so they give them crayons and pencils and other things that don't work for the kids.

4:00 p.m. – Creative Caring – Creative Caring

We want to sponsor a community baby shower for new parents at UMC. The Las Vegas Craftateers will donate homemade blankets and hats, and everyone will have a chance to donate toward the cause. I want to have a small celebration for the nurses and other hospital staff. We came up with the name when my mother and I saw a homeless man eating noodles on the side of the road. Since we will be handing out the packages to those who are living in shelters and experiencing homelessness, I am sure that the people who are receiving them will tell their friends and neighbors about the packages we will be handing out.

4:30 p.m. – Mahay Medical Group – Doctor for a Day

The project is a kids' health clinic. Kids will come and learn how to stay healthy, eat the right foods, have good hygiene, and safety while exercising. I hope to invite the American Heart and Lung Associations to present ways to encourage healthy living for kids and teens. I am interested in being a doctor. I am hopeful that this will be a great introduction to my career in medicine and help kids have exposure to doctors and healthy living.

4:30 p.m. – Nasir's National Asthma Day - Nasir's National Asthma Day

I have asthma and recently I was sick. I had to stay out of school for a week. Many kids don't know what asthma is so I want to teach the kids at my school and in my neighborhood about asthma. 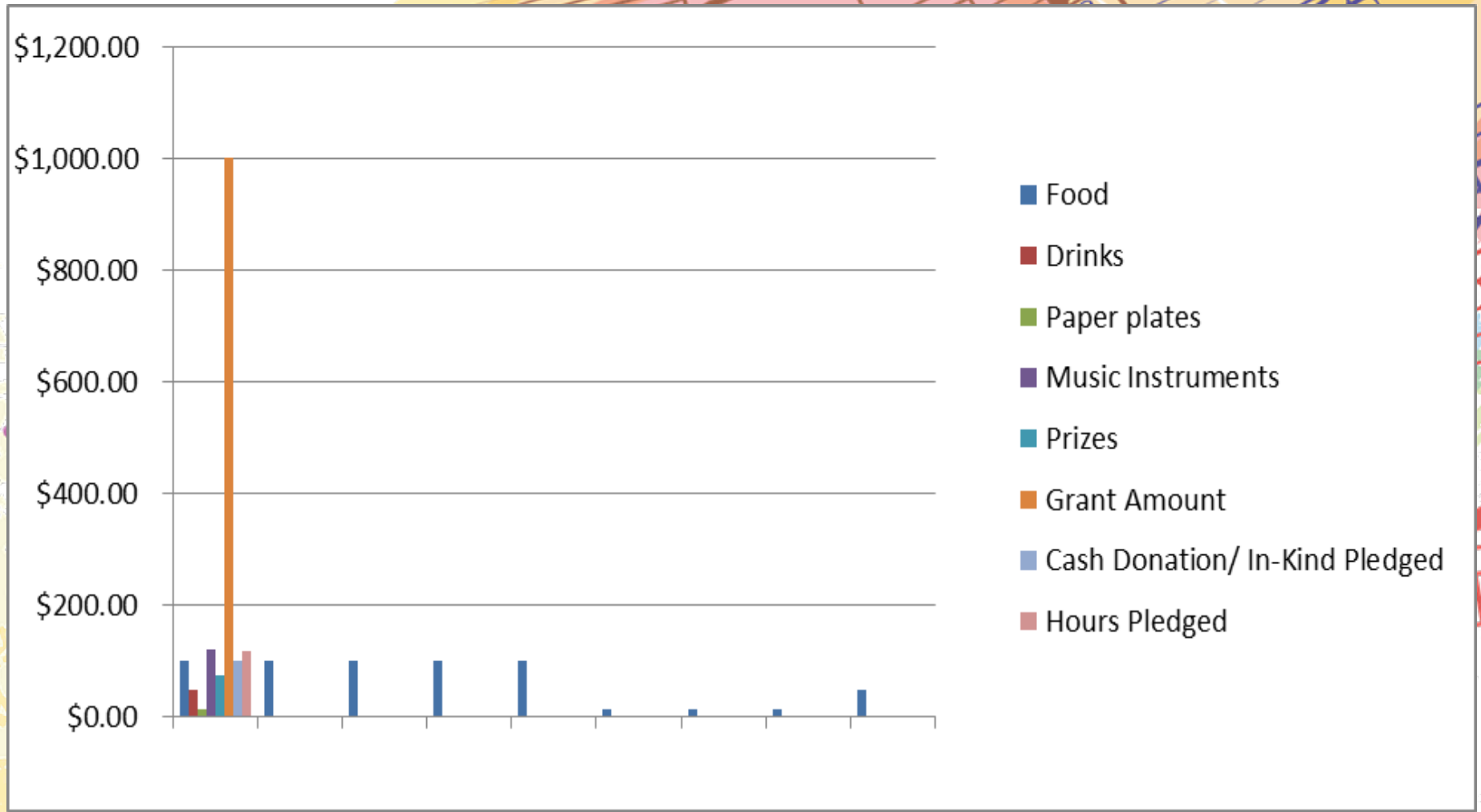

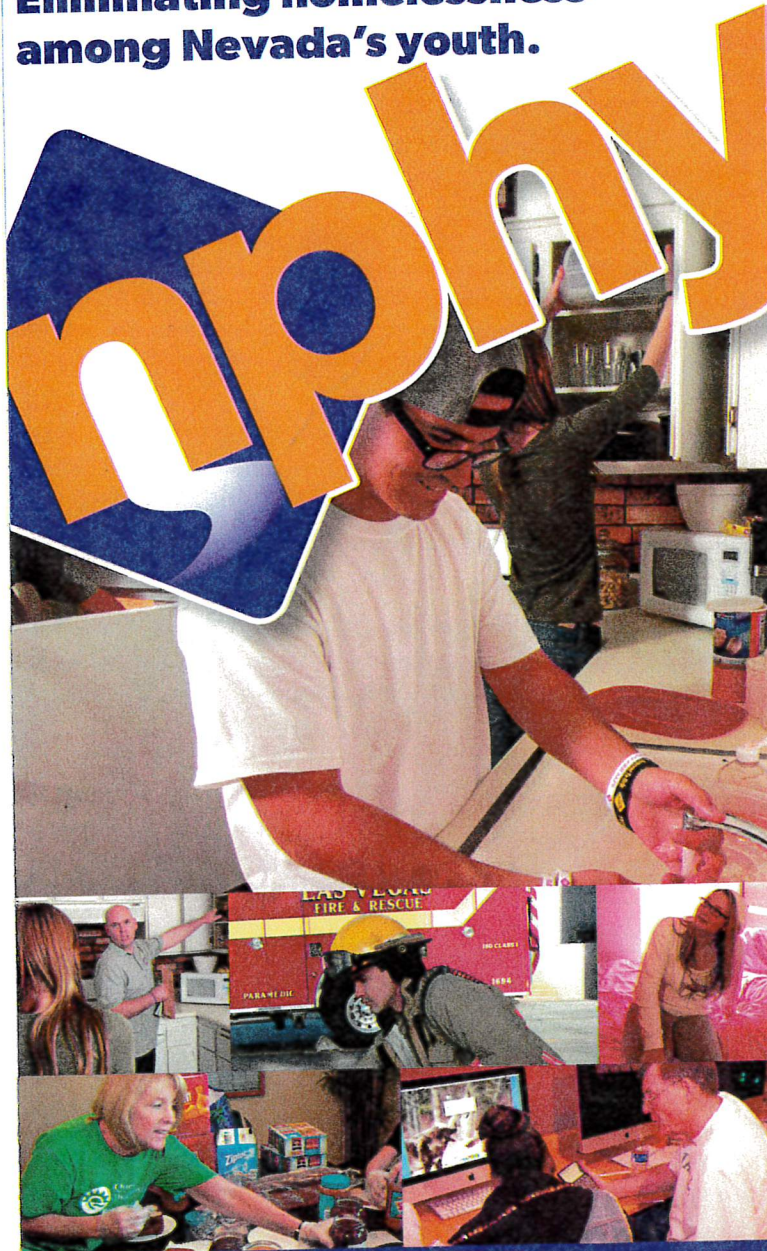

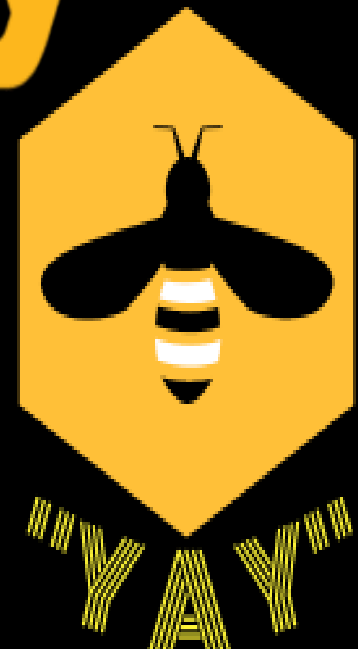
